

## What Military Service Members, Veterans and Parents Are Saying

"Currently in the military as O3 and let me tell you, it is an absolute joke. Integrity and honor are not rewarded but diversity and sexuality is. The abuse to those who work hard and show up on time is remarkable versus the others who lack motivation and are extremely lazy. How anything gets done now is astonishing. If you're looking for discipline and character building, go work for an independent business; the military is a far cry from what it used to be."

"I just retired from the Marine Corps after 20 years last year and it's getting out of hand. You've got leadership that doesn't care about anything except these woke policies. I know lots of Marines that are getting out because they are tired of it, as well as Marines, who wanted to do more than 20 years but they are tired of the woke culture."

"I have 3 years until retirement and I can't wait. The woke mindset and the lack of real standards and discipline make the Army a joke."

"Is Woke Culture Ruining the Military? As a U.S Air Force Veteran who just got out in March of this year...YES!"

"I'm retiring in July after 22 years 100% because of the new woke BS. We spend a significant amount of time dedicated to woke agenda and I've had enough. gender identification acceptance, pronouns, etc. I honestly DO NOT care what the person is or thinks they are, but at the same time I don't want an agenda FORCED down my throat. I believe what I believe and others are free to believe what they want. Just let me do my job of defending this nation."

"Same here. I'm almost able to retire from active service and can't wait."

"My son, who wanted to be a Marine his entire youth, left after 5 years, disgusted with the new 'woke' Marines."

"Having just retired from the military within the last year, I'm guessing the SecArmy has not had to sit through the "mandatory training" that has begun since Biden took over. If she had, she would have the answer to the question about wokeness."

"Wormuth is lying through her teeth. I just retired Jan of 2022 and woke policies were being enforced and promotion limiting (reprimand letters) punishments were being handed out to leaders using the wrong pronouns."

"This SecArmy is delusional. Every one of my former soldiers who got out did so because of this woke nonsense that harms morale and readiness."

"As a current Active Duty Service Member, I can tell you that the military has become weak and woke at the leadership level."

"Woke ideologies, policies, and leadership is the primary reason I decided to retire from the Army after more than 26 years of service."

"Attended a DEI session for new Colonels.

Assignment was to respond to a role-player who argued that military is not systemically racist. Not one respondent offered a counterargument; all inputs were ad hominem attacks. Look me in the eye and tell me our military isn't woke."

"Yes, it is super woke now. Gotta deal with it every day."

"My son was an Airborne Ranger. He joined the Army straight out of high school. When he got out, he told me that for the final year that he was in uniform, a solid third of the "training" that he received was in topics like "Proper Use of Pronouns", "Gender Equality", etc. I suspect that right there alongside the recruitment problem is a problem retaining the trained soldiers that want no part of the stupidity that is "woke" culture."

"Just retired after 41 yrs in Army Reserve. It's different now. Now you must bow down to every woke concept they throw at you. This will literally ruin the military in about 5 yrs if left unchecked."

"This is why I got out 3 years early from my retirement target."

"I know a model Marine, 6'1, 230lbs of monster muscle did not re-up because of wokeness."

"I'm on active duty and believe me, I never thought I'd serve in a force that requires its members to, when called upon, stand up and proudly affirm that men can indeed get pregnant. Failure to do so gets you drummed out of the ranks as a bigot. What a world. So brave, so new."

"My daughter (68B, E-6) is calling it quits after 6 years. "The Army's values no longer align with mine, Dad. I can't do it anymore."

"I'm in the AF but it gets harder and harder to serve with the virtue signaling they try to force upon us. It is a Marxist strategy to diminish then destroy the family unit. Disgusting."

"Yes, military is woke. They tried to shove a pride run down my throat. I'm a SFC medic active duty. I'm over it. I'm trying to get out."

"I have 4 years until I retire and I don't know if I can make it. It's a torturous level of ridiculous getting worse each and every day."

"After 20 years of commissioned service, I tell folks all the time--no matter how woke you think the armed forces are, it is much worse."

"A high-ranking friend recently told me the increasing pressure to be politically correct was a burden & distraction he hated."

"My nephew, a Master Sergeant tells me recruits are leaving immediately after enlistments expire. They are sick and tired of all the seminars, reading materials, and strange impromptu "interviews" probing attitudes toward race, gender, and sexual preference. Retention is an even bigger problem than recruitment. The military has turned into a social experiment laboratory."

"Came back last year from the Marines, and it's a shit show honestly."

"I'm retired with 24 years of active duty, and still have friends who are still active. They tell me our military has gone off the deep end. Completely woke, weak, confused, untrained, and a complete embarrassment. A total clown show."

"I spoke only last week to an old friend who was a high-ranking officer, and who took early retirement. Why? Because, he said, the officer corps has become highly politicized, and to the Left. He said he feels he can no longer be effective as a leader And, he said, the politicization is harming readiness."

"The majority of military members don't THINK the Pentagon has become politicized... they KNOW it for a fact. I've got a pair of sons in the Army. Some of the stories they tell me about the woke briefings they have to sit through..."

"Yes, it's a woke military and that's why I retired. We are screwed due to our weak leadership."

"I spent the weekend camping out with several ex military and several active duty military. 3 of the active duty soldiers said their getting out this year after 11 yrs of a career decision saying today's military is a joke and it's not worth continuing forward to their 20 yr goal."

"I got out recently as a multigenerational family myself and told my nephews and nieces not to join it's not worth it."

"I learned last week my brother in law retired partly because of the wokeness. He has been in the Air Force for over 20 years and he's sick of it."

"I spent 10 years in the Army. I planned on making a career but it got so hateful and political. I was passed over several times for promotions just because the Army had to promote minorities and females. I wouldn't recommend today's military to anyone. It's a joke."

"My dad and father in law both served in the military, and now my son-in-law is in the Army. He says wokeness is killing the morale of the enlisted men."

"Son started serving under previous administration we every intention on 20+ yr military career. Loves flying but will not reenlist under leadership that is never held accountable for failure & openly unlawful actions against service members. Generations of family service too."

"Left the Marine Corps because of the woke stuff."

"My four year enlistment was enough to realize I didn't want to make the Air Force a career."

"2 of my nephews were Active Duty. 1 was a Naval Aviator, Instructor & flew the Growler & F-35s. Planned on making it his career. He left last year saying, "I can't take the Woke Crap Any longer". My other Nephew was Army, Avionics. Worked on Apaches etc. He left last yr for the same reason."

"My Son is in the AF. His six year enlistment is coming to a close (He's Air Traffic Control) and he has also decided to walk away and go work in the Civilian Sector."

"I'm glad I retire out of the army in two years. 20 years and I've seen the downfall of the thing I used to love."

"My son is due to retire from the Navy after 25 years. He told me that due to these political policies he can't wait to leave. I'm just glad he is at the end of his career and not the beginning."

"My friend's son joined the Army during the covid lockdown hysteria. He was always going to be in some computer related field after basic training (he's in intelligence now) but he was really looking forward to playing with guns and ammo during basic training, because he knew he wouldn't have a

chance later. Instead, he said they sat "criss-cross applesauce", and were lectured about diversity, inclusion, white supremacy, pronouns, and other wokeness. This is not how you build a strong military."

"Well, my son has been in the USAF for 14 years. He just visited us and said the morale is the worst he has ever seen. He said they are getting overwhelmed with a focus via training and propaganda on LGBTQ indoctrination. He is getting out after his next 4 years is up."

"A friend of mine has a son in the AF that is an officer. He has a masters degree in Aeronautical Engineering. He told his dad he is retiring in a few months and that it can't happen soon enough. He says that the "woke" garbage being shoved down their throats is sickening, and he can't take it anymore. He says there are many officers and enlisted that feel the same way and will be leaving the service. As bad as the Russian military has performed in Ukraine, I doubt if we could even defeat them on a battlefield."

"Every generation of mine has been in the service from WW1 to a few years ago. 2 years ago my nephew ended resigning up, he said "he didn't sign up for this shit." He was planning to make a career out of it. Good young man too."

"My kid came out after six years, finished up his engineering degree, and told anyone who would listen to never enlist."

"My stepson left the Navy about 3 weeks ago after 13 years. SO happy he left. He said it was an absolute shit show."

"My son in law is a special forces medic, three tours in the Middle East and now is teaching his people about accepting transgenders in the military. This is a real soldier who says the army will never be a fighting force again. He's one year away

from twenty years and said he may not make it to retirement. May God bless our real defenders of freedom."

"When you're in the military and have to deal with woke, you're dealing with it 24/7, 365 days a year. You're on the clock 24 hrs a day. There is no escape, so yeah, it is a big reason why recruiting is down and retention is suffering also. It also seems by design. It's no coincidence that the politicians who push woke policies also hate the military and everything that it stands for."

"It's terrible. I retired last year from the military, 27 1/2 years, am very proud of my service. Things changing over time is to be expected, however, the changes in the past several years have been drastic & disappointing. We need to do better & change course. Will stop there."

"My brother, career military, is trying to hang on until he retires. He doesn't want to blow his pension by leaving early. He's got a few years left. However, he's disgusted by how the military caters to woke these days. He keeps his mouth shut and does his job, but he's not proud of what the military has become.

I don't have to prompt him to bring up how disgusted he is. I try to avoid talking about politics and the military, so the fact that he brings it up without me promoting is a clue that something radically different is going on. Leadership matters and we are being presented with crazy and being told it's the rational, adult choice. I'm not going to be encouraging my teen son to join the armed forces. I just can't do it with a straight face. In the past, that wouldn't be an issue. Culture matters and the military has gone nutters."

"I was the Equal Opportunity Adviser for an Army installation in 2009. We got a new mission statement. It was called "Blueprint for the Nation". It was sold as "what the military does, the nation

will follow". We removed all references to "unity" and replaced them with "diversity." We also were forbidden from saying "melting pot" and replaced it with "salad bowl". Now here we are. A nation divided. No unity. No national identity. This plan for our collapse and civil war has been long in the making. I don't believe there is a path forward for bringing back what our forefathers knew. Very sad."

"My granddaughter's husband is a West Point graduate who served 8 years in Special Forces. He left the Army last year. Why? "We spent more time in social justice classes than we did on the range".

"As a current military member, I can attest to this (military going woke). I have lost commanders and troops who left, citing the federal government's acceptance of unconscious bias/systemic racism doctrines. As a soldier, you are faced with this paradox: either the accusation is true, and you are a racist, or at least live in a racist country, or, the doctrine is false, and you live in a country of idealogues who are willing to destroy you with their lies. Who wants to die for either of those? This is the result of deconstructionist philosophy. It always corrodes. Anyone interested should read a book written by a military officer who was fired for his words, "Irresistible Revolution" by Lohmeier. Every example he gives, I have seen myself firsthand."

"Met a young man a couple weeks ago who was medically discharged from the Army. Gave me an earful about all of the DEI training now. That is not my US military!"

"It's true. The woke agenda was a leading factor in my decision to retire after 22 years. I was seeing a new generation of Soldiers that I would not want in a foxhole with me."

"We know 2 brothers who are young, patriotic, dedicated Marines who joined the corps carrying on a family legacy of service. They both fulfilled their first term of enlistment and then got out because of the indoctrination and woke ideology."

"My best friend's grandson just recently refused to reenlist in the USN. Reason: too much social pressure from top ranking officers and senior NCOs. Too many Woke programs."

"Served 27 years in USAF and worked 18 more at a Special Operations Base. WOKE and diversity has been jammed down our throats. I'm finally done with this whole works. Our military used to be strong. Today, if it's more than a touch of a button, we're doomed. We've become fat, lax, and lazy. Most cannot even do their basic job. Pathetic do see our military go down the drain."

"My family has a long history of serving that goes back generations, both mother and father are vets. My older brother in the Army hates it. The wokeness is terrible, he's had to attend a number of CRT sessions – one where he had to wear an "oppressor" sign around his neck for the day. He said it's all very humiliating and has created bad morale. Despite wanting it since I was a kid, I decided I'll find another way to help my country. I'm not joining an organization that will treat me with contempt for who I am. Very saddened by what has happened I'm not sure we win wars."

"My nephew retired from the 82nd Airborne in the last year. Thank God he's the last family member to leave the "Joke" Military. He wanted to be a lifer and he served more than 15 years, but said to Hell with it when the Military became a Woke Joke."

"I just retired. Too much focus on wokeness and social justice, not enough focus on preparing for war. No longer are the best and brightest promoted but now it's who meets the diversity and equity

"As a retired USAF member, I can unequivocally state that there is far too much emphasis the woke agenda than there is on the mission."

"I retired with 21 years of service and have worked as a contractor for the military for 20 more years. The military culture has changed dramatically in 40 years... for the worse. Standards seem to be out the window and there's very little motivation toward achieving goals. Commanders are scared to make decisions without consulting an army of lawyers, and every decision has to be politically correct and "woke". Those type of decision-making cycles get soldiers killed. It's no wonder kids no longer want to serve. Military vets are warning their kids and others not to join. Remove the woke and the esprit de corp will return."

"My father retired from the Air Force with 30 years. I retired from the Army with 21. I still work as a contractor for the military, and I can say with great discomfort that the military I knew is no more. Physical requirements have been rolled back, aptitude tests have been dumbed down, and standards in general are waved for many categories. It scares me that soldiers have to serve under a president that doesn't value their lives nor cares about the military in general."

"The politicalization of the senior officer ranks where DEI is over indexed to the extreme."

"You're right. And there is another aspect that most people don't realize. Over the last two decades, a number of general and flag officer positions have been filled with members of the Senior Executive Service (SES), and many new positions have been created for them as well. Now we have senior leaders in the military who have never worn the

uniform, never been part of the military culture, and who tend to become more politicized. Plus they don't rotate at the frequency of military officers. If the goal is a less politicized military, these positions need to be rolled back."

"I am on all branches bases, installations conducting business. Must say, as a veteran of 2 wars-conflicts, 14 years Active Duty, it is VERY discouraging and scary to see the utter lack of decorum, respect and discipline we were taught makes the greatest fighting military in the world! Is it a coincidence the USA is at its weakest point over these past 3 years? I think NOT!"

"A friend of mine's Grandson just got out of USMC Boot Camp. He went to the rifle range twice, bivouac once. diversity training the rest of the time. Sad to say that the boy feels very disappointed after his Grandfather told him what the Marines USED TO BE before he enlisted! My Buddy, his Grandpa, had no idea it had gotten that bad, me either."

"As a legacy American (settler, not immigrant) my family has served in the US military in every war since the Revolution. Some died, some lived to tell stories. My wife's uncles and mine were on opposite sides in the War between the States. My uncle Cecil died at Normandy. My Dad landed Marines on Iwo Jima. Two dead relatives in Korea. Four in Vietnam. My wife and I served in the 70's. My son did three tours in Afghanistan. All that to show my history and I WOULD NEVER SUGGEST ANYONE JOIN THE CURRENT US MILITARY! It's simply not the same country and I fear it never will be again."

"Retired in 2017. Was already starting to go woke. So glad I'm done."

"Getting out in about month and a half... feels like the day can't come soon enough." "My nephew was on a nuke submarine for 3 years. When his enlistment was up I thought he was going to reenlist. He's said no f--n way he wanted any part of what the navy is pushing."

"I retired November 2021 from the US Navy after 24 years of service due to the policies being pushed down from the top. I saw just how spineless top officers had become."

"All three of my military sons were very glad to get out of the woke military in the past few years. I believe (I hope, actually) that a very long family military tradition has now ended with them. I do not want any more of my sons or my grandchildren ever serving this corrupt military elite and even more corrupt civilian leaders."

"My sons are the first generation in our entire family line to NOT serve in the military. I retired from active duty a few years back and have repeatedly discouraged both my boys from serving at all costs strictly BECAUSE of woke leftist ideology that has taken hold. Rare is the real war-fighter found serving in the current uniformed leftist indoctrination regimes. They've been phased out through years of "tolerance" training and soulless 'yes-man' promoting regardless of mission decay. PC culture has massacred any and all military tradition & lethality. Nothing but soft betas now."

"I was active AF for 23 yrs, plus another 1.5 as a G.S. All medical, but I served both enlisted and commissioned. I could see the wokism encroaching even before I retired nearly 10 years ago. I guess I'm just another of the voices saying "thank God I'm not in anymore". Do your best. Stick to standards, and be ultra consistent in how you address deviation from standards...I guess that's the only useful thing I could say. How is diversity and sexuality rewarded? it's rewarded by presenting PowerPoints celebrating both, having meetings reinforcing these core beliefs, getting emails

regarding them, pointing out individuals for either their skin color or sexuality and showing favoritism as well."

"My son has been in the Army for 2 1/2 years and he is getting out. He says the Army has gone completely woke and has lost what the military has always stood for. Very sad."

"My son had childhood dreams of joining the Navy and becoming a submariner, but has chosen another path due to the woke agenda."

"I joined the Air Force 2 years ago. Don't join. I should have listened to the people who tried to warn me not to. How can you form effective teams when some people have preferential treatment based on things like sexual preference and you can't trust that they won't use that advantage to tear you down or end your career? I don't have a job that is really dangerous or anything but it's the military. You have to expect the possibility of having your life on the line and I can't say I have much confidence in many people's ability to perform in even slightly dangerous situations."

"It's no longer the apolitical military the American people can count on. I'm done when I hit my retirement a year from now."

"As someone that's currently active for 19 years, the route that the military has taken would absolutely make me not want to do it again. I've had so many first term enlisted ask questions and opinions from me. Not because of going to war but because of politics and policies put in place."

"I had a long conversation with a young officer recently and asked him the reaction to the 'woke' military mandates from above. He said, "None of us believe that stuff. We just laugh it off and ignore what they say." That sounds like the opposite of respect for the chain of command."

--- "Not entirely true. My son, who is a sergeant,

cannot apply the same discipline to certain special groups of people for fear of being disciplined by his superior officers. It's not the military of yesterday when you have different rules for some, merely because of the color of their skin and/or their sexual preferences. This process breeds resentment, which is the last thing you need in that environment."

"Wokeness is 100% hurting recruitment. I was in the military for 21 years and I'm still in contact with people I served with who are active duty. They tell me all the time that it's 100% woke now....pronouns.....LGBTQ and trans-gender trainings. What concerns me the most, this administration has severed the bond between the military and "generational families". Those families where all the men or women served so it's a tradition for the kids to follow. I see 1990's / early 2000's vets telling their kids in 2023 "NO" and "Don't do it" because of the wokeness, poor VA care post service, and things like the way this administration pulled the plug on Afghanistan or launched the "there's a white nationalist problem in our military" campaign where instead of just investigating any issues and dealing with it, they preferred to just call every white guy a white nationalist through seminars and trainings. I also believe the left is assassinating national pride in America which is causing more and more young folks to hate their country and not want to serve. It's a sickening and sad situation. Elections have consequences and we as a nation need to fix this!"

"I am a SFC in the Army with 13 years in, DO NOT JOIN it is an absolute mess right now and we are so weak."

"Believe me when I say...as a veteran, with three other family members who are/were veterans...this new woke crap means everything. Plus, reservists are retiring early; active duty members are not re-

enlisting. The leadership of our country...including the military...is destroying everything good and strong and moral about us with this focus on personal (fictional) identities & climate sh\*\*, instead of colorblind combatting of evil. And we cannot help but pay the price in the future. So tragic."

"I'm an army vet and I'm still in touch with some of my buddies who stayed in and they absolutely have gone. Woke. They've had to change their language completely to accommodate incoming recruits."

"Wokeness is absolutely affecting the military. I personally know guys in the Navy who have over 20, but aren't being allowed to submit their retirement paperwork because recruitment and retention has been negatively impacted by horrible liberal policies. They can lie and obfuscate in front of congress all day long, but the troops know that limp wristed leaders have negatively impacted serving."

"My grandson wanted to join the Navy since he was 16. He did research and decided that he wanted to be a Gunners Mate. He graduated high school with honors and decided to enlist instead of going to college. Since joining he's attended multiple schools finishing at the top of his class in all. His first command put him on the fast track program and in less than 5 years he was promoted to E-6 (Gunners Mate Petty Officer First Class (SW). He's currently in his second enlistment. After reporting to a new command he said things really changed. It's become woke and political. He says unless things change for the better he will not be re-enlisting again."

"I joined in 2005 and some of my best memories is basic training. The drill sergeants I had been to combat, great shape, and knowledgeable. It was exactly what I expected. Fast forward to 2019. I got out of active and doing my last year in the guard. I'm doing mandatory transgender training. I'm being told we have to respect them. I remember one of the female's asked if a transgender female could use women's restrooms. The answer was yes and we had to accept it. I knew then I didn't want any part of this Army. I got out several months later...no regrets getting out."

"I am also a USMC veteran, and my son, despite my best efforts to discourage him from doing so, became a Marine and is about 3 months away from completing his 4 year enlistment. He can't wait to be out, and they didn't even offer him any kind of reenlistment incentives at all, even though he is a solid NCO with exemplary service."

"My wife and brother in law both got out of the AF. The schools on base have gone woke on the children. During lock down, the bases would allow airmen to leave for woke protests otherwise they had to stay. After doing PT, the first shirts would have some kind of woke agenda they would ask the units to participate in, etc. It's been a hard push in one direction and you become ostracized for not participating."

"This is NOT the same military my dad or I enlisted in. It seems to have become a lab for social experimentation. Our enemies take great comfort in the inept and compromised senior leadership who are more concerned with PC, CRT, and pronoun as opposed to war fighting. Whereas our enemies are focusing on fighting and winning wars."

--"I wish you weren't right, but you are. I enlisted in 1998 and recently retired in 2021. The term 'dumpster fire' doesn't even come close to describing what the military had turned into by the time I got out. I was told to conduct extremism training to my troops and the material was 100% about right-wing extremists. I asked if I had leeway to discuss the left-wing extremism that was also

prevalent (BLM, ANTIFA etc) and was told no, stick to the material provided. I also had to give gender equality training that heavily consisted of transexuals and their transitioning process. It was clear what was happening and I'm glad I got out when I did."

"I recently talked 2 nephews out of it. I served 10 years with multiple tours to Iraq and was a recruiter. I would highly advise against service with the way things are being run right now."

"24 years in, about to retire. My son wanted to follow in my footsteps and join. I've discouraged him (his choice) from doing so. It's a mess fight now."

"As a veteran for 10 years, it is an absolute joke. Those who work hard vs those who are in for a paycheck and do the bare minimum get rewarded the same and promoted the same. It becomes a game of numbers and officers sanction enlisted for the same exact things the officers do. Leadership is a clown show and work ethic is nonexistent due to lack of accountability. When the military presented this Extremism training which was all about targeting right wing groups after January 6, but did not implement or vilify anything about left wing groups, I knew I had to do something to get me out of there, and I did. That and the Afghanistan withdrawal were the reasons I did what I did."

"Another Marine veteran commenting here - I have friends nearing retirement in multiple branches and they send me screen shots of "programs" and "initiatives" that are nothing but complete wokeness. It's an absolutely disgusting place our military is in and we need to clean house. Start with commander in chief and work all the way down through every complacent officer there is. And to be very clear, every single officer is complicit right now. The good ones have all gotten kicked out

(mostly for Covid reasons). Our military is weak. It can be fixed. But it's gonna be painful."

"I proudly served 25 years in the Army. Most Soldiers I know today, including two of my sons, are just hanging on until they hit 20, if they're close, or until their current enlistment expires. It will take massive investments of time and money to rebuild our military once this administration ends."

"I have a son in-law in the Navy who planned on retiring from there he only has a few years to go but he has now decided as soon as his current obligation runs out he is leaving. Democrats have achieved their dream destruction of our military . No way I would recommend anyone join."

"With all due respect.... I've come from a long line of family members serving this great country. I retired in Feb 2023 after 24 YOS. Couldn't take the forced "It's not OK to be White" training requirement."

"I retired from the military 2 years ago and I don't want my kids joining. It was a pretty good gig for me and I'm happy to have served, but there's no way I would recommend it to anyone. Having to walk on eggshells in order to prevent ruining your career and future definitely isn't worth it now. Wokeness and cancel culture are ruining everything."

"23 year old Army Vet. I'm glad I ETSd. Shit is only getting worse and worse. I absolutely will not be

rejoining our nation's military for any reason... ever. For this exact reason."

"My son is a Navy Lt flying Seahawks; I'm retired USAF Lt Col/ former pilot of God's gift to man, the UH-1N. I pray for the day he can leave. I could not recommend anyone join today, our oath was to the Constitution, not to ideology. USAFA '90"

"When I was in, they allowed transgenders and it didn't make any sense. We got talked to by an admiral and did like 10 meetings on transgender sensitivity training. I am no longer in."

"I retired in 2021 after 21 years. Sorry to say, but it's too late...upper level leadership is completely woke at this point."

"I retired after 25+ years last February. I made this life changing decision after what I deemed was CRT indoctrination. They called it something else. My inner voice became an external tirade of disagreement, and I knew this was a battle I was going to lose. Cowardly, I decided to exit with my pension intact. The problem with this is so did a great many of my cohort of technical and tactical experts. The "Great Purge" continues."

"I was surprised when my youngest son enlisted in 2012. A Black Hawk Crew Chief he was on his way to flight school when he attended a leadership class on 'What to do if your male solider becomes pregnant or has their period.' He had complained that half their time was spent in HR classes instead of training. Lack of flight hours, field training, competency in individual and collective tasks and skills. And so, much to the disappointment of this old soldier, he made the right decision, giving up his opportunity to become a pilot and got out. Today he has a degree in mathematics and a master's from Embry Riddle in Aerospace Aviation Management and Safety and is employed as the Director of Safety for a cargo airline. He and his

family are doing quite well, and he certainly doesn't regret his decision. Regrettably, neither do I as his father. US Army Retired."

"It's because of the wokeness. My hubs retired after 38 years in. A fellow soldier told him he was forced to sign agreements accepting men dressing as women in the Army. The guy told his commander "I'll sign it but I'm telling you I don't agree with this." He still received a negative mark in his record just for an off the record opinion."

"25 years active duty and still work for the army as a civilian. This army is way more concerned with social issues and equity than warfighting. Discipline is lax and I sometimes think the commanders from company to brigade are severely concerned about not doing anything to get relieved, much more than training for war. I don't see this ever reversing, one reason I would not recommend service in the Army. Sad to say...."

"My son recently retired from the military. They spent more time in classes that taught political correctness than they did in flight briefs. Within a three month period, his squadron lost almost 60% of their pilots and crews. The airlines pay much better anyway."

"I chose not to reenlist because of this craziness. When The Chairman called my white counterparts terrorists and suggested that all units have extremists in them, and wanted to examine white Soldiers for their beliefs... His statements vs. what was sent out were very different. The SecDef echoed those views and worse, and I was among MANY service members from my base who refused to reenlist under this administration, some with as many as 15 years of service. "I have a family member who was going to career in the Marines. As soon as his hitch was up he left. Refused to reenlist. Couldn't blame him."

"Yeah, I just retired from the Air Force last May after putting in 35 years; last 5 were the worse; poor leadership, no accountability, people unfit to actually be in uniform (fat/overweight), list goes on and on!"

"My brother in law just retired from 25 years in the Army at Ft. Bragg as special forces. Been all over the world and done it all. Made a very good living. He said Sunday night that I should never let my 15 year old son join. It's an embarrassment."

"As for the military, my youngest son thought he wanted to be a lifer. Once he got in and watched the destruction in real time he decided he wanted no part of the destruction of the institution every male in his lineage has served in one way or another."

"I'm so happy I got out in 2017. I'm proud of my service, but I would never let my kids join. Sadly, the Army has changed so much over the last decade. Not sure if we are the good guys anymore."

"I couldn't wait to retire because of the wokeness and climate change agenda that was being pushed & he's right the ads are absolutely ridiculous, and I'm embarrassed at the direction of our once great military."

"I stopped by the Unit I retired from in 2016 later that year. They were getting ready to have the usual classes the Military requires periodically. My Commander wanted me to stick around for the Transgender training."

"They spend more time peddling redundant irrelevant social training than military skills training. My husband and I retired just in time, however our

oldest daughter is only spending her initial enlistment in the Army due to all the woke distractions."

"I served 34 1/2 years in the military! Retired May 2022! The military has become political and is going woke!!! I got tired of having to sit thru briefing weekly on diversity and acceptance! If you were minority you were giving preferential treatment when it came to promotion, schools, housing and positions and duty locations! I'm glad I'm out and I won't recommend anyone joining!"

"Family served Marine Corps and Army with multiple combat tours. Told all my 5 sons to not even consider a career in the military. The leadership has betrayed their mission. Lie all they want but combat readiness is not their goal."

"I can tell you here in the real world my Grandson just out of college, Eagle Scout, 3 years NJROTC, many hours of community service, very athletic and many of his Friends want nothing to do with Biden WOKIES."

"It is not the rhetoric. It is the imposition of woke on potential recruits. Same as any corporation. Go woke go broke. In the military case, go woke, no poke. Recruits to the military do not want the woke lifestyle."

"My son graduated high school 2 yrs ago . He wants to go into the Air Force. He won't join b/c of this Admin & the current b.s. going on in all the Armed Forces. My other son joined the Navy did his 3 yrs & said FTS. He came home in December. It's not like it used to be."

"I retired in 2019 and most of my fellow soldiers were all saying they would retire or not re-enlist because we could see what was coming down the road. The military does not want to go woke and should never be used for politics and testing new social policies."

"I served in the Navy in the 80's and 90's; my son is currently in the National Guard and is preparing for his 3rd deployment. Listening to him talk, antiwoke rhetoric is NOT the problem. The woke policies and inept leadership at the top ARE the problems. Flag officers are being put into positions they are not suited for because of who they know, because they have the right agendas or because they do not "rock the boat". Meanwhile, other candidates are not selected and pretty much forced to retire because they are willing to call out issues and stand up for their soldiers, sailors and marines. These inept leaders and their failed policies are having a direct impact on retention. My son was telling me this week how his unit struggles to retain people."

"I served 22 years in the Army, retiring in 2006. I was also in USAREC, the Army's recruiting command, for a number of years. I have seen some wild swings over the years given the politics in the USA. But never anything like this. Using cartoons that exploit the sexuality of a recruit's parents is just whacky. You are a fighting force. Concentrate on fighting and winning wars. Use that Warrior mentality in your recruiting campaigns and you will succeed. Look at the Marines. They are staying fairly focused during this Woke political climate. They are leading by example."

"9 generations of our family served in the Navy and Marines. Generation X opted out. Generation Z never considered it. You have to believe the government and people you serve. The Democrats are unbelievable."

"I no longer recommend military service. It's kinda hard to fight a war when you are worried about pronouns. Served over 24 years USN."

"A few years ago the military was a viable option for my son. He's now 17, and we've completely

eliminated the military as an option. There is no place in the military for woke policies."

"I wouldn't serve in Austin's woke military either, and I know many other veterans who say the same thing. Any military whose mission it is to serve as a cultural diversity experiment over giving me the best training and equipment for the best chance for survival is not going to draw the best men for the job."

"I can tell you that anyone who has been in the military is telling anyone thinking about joining to not join. The military is no longer a place where the best of the best are leading."

"I served 23 years as an officer, and although I don't regret a minute of it and wouldn't change a thing, there is no way in hell I would serve today."

"Why can't our top military leaders figure out that the reason for people enlisting at such a low rate is due to their DEI push? People want nothing to do with it. This is not rocket science. When someone is shooting at you, they could give a fig what your pronouns are."

"The military was the most level racial playground that I experienced (84-2015). It used to have a merit and ability basis that silenced racism."

"I was a Marine. In the current climate I would never repeat. And I am glad neither of my children have any interest in the military. Maybe this is the end of America."

"It's not the military anymore, it's a social experiment. Many are hanging on to get to retirement and their done. I retired as soon as I could. I don't want my kids to serve in this woke bullshit."

"The minority report that came out in 2020 is essentially the reason I left the military. The means of being promoted by TIG and TIS combined with merit was being pushed out, and promotion based on skin color was taken over."

"I am a Department of the Army civilian (civil servant) with 30+ years of service. I work for a civilian-heavy organization of roughly 1500 people. We are going woke, and it's accelerating. In 2021 we had the first ever Pride Week. There were several events. The week culminated with a Pride Walk around our little base. It was kicked off by a "special guest" who pranced around tossing rose petals in the air. The group marched behind a big Pride flag. People are moving up their retirements because of the creeping wokeness. I can tell you that our Commander cares not a whit about that. He'll be gone next year, and

a new wokeling will take the reins and lead us further down the road to perdition."

"As someone who served in the Marine Corps from 2013-2018, I have three words for those considering joining: DO NOT JOIN."

"I personally have 2 family members separating from military duty ASAP, due to the woke policies, the jab mandate, and the resident in the White House, and his idiotic police policies. Two other family members were considering military service, to uphold our strong family tradition of military service, but will not consider joining now, due to the above reasons. 4 people from one family. That says a lot, I think."

"As a Veteran I discouraged my son from taking a military route. Not because of my personal experiences with combat but because of the things I hear about today's military, not only from those currently serving but those recently discharged. The whole new ideology that that military has adopted these last two years is the issue."

"Daughter has 7yrs to retirement and she is just holding on at this point as bad as it is getting. I remember affirmative action promotions from when I was in the Army during the 80's. People with no business being in charge of anything getting promoted. One of our E5's couldn't read at a grade school level."

"I retired from the USAF in 2009, still work on the base I retired from and trust me, the standards started getting lowered years ago. It's so sad and

maddening to see the quality of young troops these days. Almost every young airman, and many NCOs, that I cross paths with look like they want to kill themselves, have no pride in their uniforms. I don't know what's going on but it's shameful."

"As a veteran, I would not join the military today. I advise young people against it when they ask me about it. Individuals I know who are currently serving echo my sentiments. I find this incredibly sad, as I come from a line of veterans...."

"I'm a retired 5th generation officer. I'm actively encouraging my kids to pursue another path so long as people like you are running the military. There is no honor in fighting for the priorities of this admin/congress. But good luck fighting climate change with diversity."

"My family has served every generation since immigrating to this nation since the 1800s. Me and my brother are the last who will ever enlist. Thanks for ruining our honorable tradition of military service."

"I deployed twice to Afghanistan and served in the 82nd and 173rd. I am not interested in sending my children to join an organization that is headed by woke commissars who do nothing but aggressively push for "diversity" and wokeism. I will be discouraging them from joining."

"Your primary recruiting base was the sons of conservative families. You went woke and now they don't want their sons anywhere near your new fabulously diverse train wreck. Go woke Go lose the next major war."

At some point military officers are more concerned about making rank instead of doing what's best for our country. Retention is at an all-time low at the same time that recruitment is as well. This is a leadership problem that starts with the administration. "21 years of service with some of the best people in the country. Now, when people ask me about whether or not to go into the military, I pretty much say not in a million years."

"I never thought I would say this: I spent 4 years active duty then 30 years in the active military reserves. During the same 30 years I was on the San Diego P.D. "I am a 30 year retired veteran of the US Army. It was my pleasure to serve the greatest nation on Earth. I served in Desert Storm, Bosnia, Iraq and Afghanistan. I am not sure I would serve today under our current Commander in Chief. Granted, I served under Carter and Obama but the attitude toward our current Armed Forces by this administration is frightening. It seems our military forces spend more time learning about hating their fellow countrymen (CRT, LGBQT and other sensitivity training) then they do training to fight

and win our nation's wars. We will definitely get our nose bloodied when we go to war against the Chinese and or North Koreans."

"I spent twelve years in the Marine Corp, but I would discourage any young person to join today under this current Biden Administration or any future Democratic Administration."

I ended my career, assigned to the Joint Staff, working at Raven Rock Mountain Complex (NMCC-Site R), something else people tend to talk about that have NO clue what they are talking about. I retired in 2011, after 22 years of Service.

So, would I recommend a young man or woman join the Army today? Not on your life. Nor the Navy, nor the Air Force/Marine Corps/Space Force/etc. The woke nonsense that has infiltrated and permeates every facete of the US Military. It's like a cancer, continuously SPREADING and GROWING within our armed services. Young Men are looking to be WARRIORS.....they aren't looking to receive classes on some DEI/CRT point. "I'm never dying for people who hate me. NEVER."

"As a veteran I'm absolutely disgusted with the socalled leadership in all the branches right now. I used to send a lot of young people to the recruiters, but I can no longer in good conscience do that until things improve."

"My grandson was the same. I have actively discouraged him the last few years because of the horrendous current leadership of the military. The last four generations of my family have served in the various branches with honor. Today, I see no honor leading those branches."

"The military has always depended on patriots to serve their country. But the new policies in the military are making it very unappealing to patriotic people, which is leaving a huge gap in recruitment and retention. The left has this idea that they can recruit more "open-minded" woke people to fill that gap, but they are learning the hard way that those woke individuals are generally far too self-absorbed to ever consider serving. So here we are with a recruitment retention crisis."

"As a 4 year Navy Vet Grandma, I would be against any of my grandchildren serving in today's WOKE military."

"My son has always wanted to be soldier. As a little boy he ran around in fatigues, he looked for any reason to. He's been in JROTC. He volunteers for everything he can... "My son has been in the Navy for 13 years and I'm I big military supporter. Given the changes in the military I would not recommend it to people and I never thought that would be the case!"

When I joined in 1981 I don't recall so many commercials often 6 or more an hour."

"It's not just the commercials, but even the movies virtually every veteran is riddled with PTSD or is a woman heroine? what's the incentive for those young men to join up in an organization that clearly doesn't respect them or want them other than the catch a bullet."

"When I retired in 1989 the politics and the woosing down of the Air Force was well under way. We now have woke generals and staff and whatever warrior officers we had or have are now gone or silenced. I too used to recommend the military to young folks, but no more. It truly is a tragedy what the politicians have done to our armed forces."

Every time he speaks with members of our family that have served or has spoken to neighbors or friends. They all ask the same thing. My father, and his father before him, served honorably in the U.S. Army. When I turned 18 and military service was an option, my father warned me against it. I think he was paying attention and knew the military was going straight downhill. Were he alive today, he'd be horrified at the woke

generals and all the nonsense under the current administration. He'd be especially distressed at how we never fight wars to actually win anymore. Dad's military service actually meant something tangible (fighting Hitler and totalitarianism); today's military service is just at the beck and call of diversity/equity/inclusion, the last things a military should be about."

"As someone who is currently on recruiting duty for a branch of the Armed Forces, I agree with the author. The sales pitch is increasingly based on tangible benefits. But even the money, bonuses, etc are not enough to entice a lot of young people. I find myself often wondering if the military is still the place for me in today's climate. I've dedicated the last 10 years of my life to it, but the military I joined is no longer the same. I just want to defend my country if called upon, but I'm not interested in being someone's political prop or pawn in the culture war."

"When I was in the service during the Vietnam War, it was regularly emphasized that we all were one color; green; and that we all bled red. The meaning

of E Pluribus Unum, From Many One; was also explained to us. Sadly, those days appear to be gone forever."

"The Long March took longer in our military, because few young Leftists were willing to subject themselves to military discipline and an atmosphere of patriotism for the sake of the cause. "I have a very bright and accomplished son who is considering the academies --- and I have to admit very mixed feelings about it that I would not have had 10 years ago. I am still immensely grateful for

what this country has meant to my Italian immigrant/ peasant family. I am in awe of where my parents started in life and where I and my siblings are today. Only in America. So when I look backwards it is easy to be patriotic. It's the present and future that drain it. I fear my son becoming a cog in a perpetual war machine. I resent his future participation in a "Battle of Taiwan" over microchips, and the dependence on them that the greed of our elites enabled. I also see a country that, more and more, sees its own citizens as its biggest threat, and i want my son to have nothing to do with defending that version of the US, which feels the need to censor and repress its own people. In the end I will support him but he will hear from me on everything I see."

"I was born at the Air Force Academy and my father had no employer in his long life other than the USAF. Every uncle, one sister, brother-in-laws... all career military. My children consider themselves patriotic, but I would not encourage them to enlist in today's military - and I feel like a heretic even writing this. Protecting your career comes first."

"My son left the Marines right before they mandated the clot-shot. He could tell it was about to happen and it was time for him to re-enlist. He had passed the tests to be part of the Recon and he was extremely dedicated. The wokeness was also a factor in his decision."

"10 grandkids. Retired from military. Father retired from military. Family members in service all the way back to Revolution. Will not recommend to grandkids."

"3rd gen military. I stopped advising any young person to join the military 5 or 6 years ago. I give them a strong warning that as a white, Christian, conservative they will be at the bottom of the sh-t pile."

"As a former infantryman, DEI has no place in the art of combat and war, so it shouldn't be there, period."

Franguildy, provide

During one of the Military Extremism Down-Days (i.e. a scheduled day of training where the topic of discussion was POTENTIAL extremist views that might be circulating around the workplace), there was an 1+ hour long seminar where a ranked officer talked about "The Art of Intersectionality" and how she used it to "get ahead" in the Military workplace! Other training segments scheduled that day included talking points about CRT, "white privilege and fragility", etc! "There is no way I would encourage my son to serve this Nation. I come from multiple generations that have served."--ret Navy Chief

"I'd break kids' leg first. I'm the last in a long line."

"I'm a VFW, I/O airborne. Dad was a red leg, granddad a Marine in Vietnam, WWII family, grandma was WAC, family on both sides of civil war, three plots for revolutionary war and 1812. Beyond that? Supposedly, who knows. No; My family will no longer be providing war fighters."

"I tell my two sons every day that I do not want to see them in the service. I do not trust the leaders that will be responsible for them to lead them right."

"I served proudly for 29 yrs and come from a family of military vets. There is no way that I will be promoting the military to my son."

"I come from a long list of service members. I'll be the last one in my fam."

"After the withdrawal of Afghanistan I can't see me ever allowing my child to join....The government uses its citizens and plays on their patriotism with lies. I lost friends and years of my life so the government can make a buck for their donors. They won't get my kids."

"My husband and I both served in the USAF and are so grateful our son hasn't joined the US military."

"My kids are not going to die for this corrupt government. PERIOD!!"

"I'm told (from a recently 20 yr vet), we the taxpayer are paying the cost of bottom surgery on male soldiers who are then placed on multiple meds and classified as "under observation" for years at a time and are no longer part of the fighting force."

"I chose to leave my 10 and a half years of service in big part because of the woke mentality. Promotions given based off woke standings instead of job ability. The mission started coming after the new ideology. I don't know how anyone would feel safe following someone into battle that openly hates you because of their woke beliefs. When I first went in, there was no emphasis on the differences in people; just on how well you performed your duties. Midway through the promotions for identities started along with biased disciplinary actions. I have much pride in my service, but I could no longer take part in what the military is becoming. "An absolute lack of trust and faith in the entire chain of command is why this family will not recommend anyone continue our tradition of service. 7 members of my immediate family in the USMC since 1962, no longer."

"Alienating the best and most patriotic young people with Wokeness and incompetence, coupled with spineless General officers who are willing to sacrifice the good of the service in favor of their own personal professional ambition, by supporting a corrosive progressive agenda where liberals who

"I think the push for DEI is a bigger factor. No one wants to be forced to accept the insane. The military says you have to accept the soldier next to you who looks like Klinger from MASH, even if goes against everything you believe in and stand for."

"I served 27 years in the Corps, fought in two wars, Vietnam and Desert Storm, and a stint in Mogadishu. My bride of 54 years looks at me every night and says she thanks God I'm not currently serving under this President or these politico/woke Generals and Admirals. Smart woman I married. ...SEMPER FI!"

"Ft Meade had a pride month celebration. One of our local supporters of the LGBTQ+ community received a beautiful glass disc with the US Army symbol and the Ft Meade logo that said "In grateful appreciation for your outstanding contribution to the success of the Fort George C. Meade Military Community LGBTQ+ Pride Month Observance.

Thank you." I have many gay friends so this does not come from a place of dislike, I don't want my military concentrating on Pride Month (or any other group "month"). I want them worrying about protecting my country. This nonsense has no place in the military and it's past time the armed services got back to their roots - protecting the nation and winning wars."

"22 year Army Vet. Thank God I retired before all this insanity. No way could I have made it a career if I had to deal with the PC/Woke bullshit."

"I retired from the Marine Corps in 2004. I am disgusted by what has happened in the last 20 years."

"You are one thousand percent right and I proudly served with straight and gay people and we never

gave a crap because we all treat each other with 1000% respect. But the woke crap going on from the top down I would never have joined nor do I recommend family members join you can either have this crap or you can have a safe country but you will not have both under no circumstances."

"It's a huge problem man. The military is more sensitive than the civilian world. I literally just got out last month and I feel so free just mentally from all that woke crap and censoring the things you can say."

"Absolutely my trans station commander is personal responsible for at least 4 people deciding to get out and over 20 recruits not getting In because they weren't woke enough. I was a recruiter until last year. She couldn't even pass her PT test but was untouchable. Toxic is an understatement."

"I went to basic in 2011 to be an infantrymen. Our drill sergeants said multiple times things like "shit is changing, the army is getting soft, y'all are going to be the last real mother f\*\*\*er's to come through this sh\*\*." They drove us hard, many guys dropped out. We didn't think anything about it at the time when they kept saying stuff like that, we thought they probably said that kind've stuff to every group to "motivate" them. However, I went to airborne holdover some months after basic, and actually spent some time hanging out with my old Drill Sergeants. They had another class at the time. I found out they were not lying. They were no longer able to smoke privates in the same manner they did to us. They could only train them so many hours a day. They could only make them do so many push-ups/sit-ups during smoke sessions. It was honestly pathetic to watch. In protest, the drill sergeants basically quit caring. They didn't even really try to train them anymore. And in hindsight, I realized they were not lying to us. It really did

change on a dime it seemed. They made sure they got one last "real group" in with us before things got soft. A couple of my drill sergeants even told me that they felt they had crossed the line many times with my group of guys by being too hard on us. I'm glad they did though. We joined the infantry to challenge ourselves as men, not to be gently guided along like toddlers."

"My entire family is military. No one else is going at this point."

"30+ years of service here. Yes it is woke, and it is getting worse every year. You will likely not hear that from our civilian and military leadership, because it's a career-ender However, the bigger problem is the mental health of all ages of our service men and women. In my experience, this is the most mentally weak our military has been, and it causes huge issues across the force. Very little resiliency!"

"Yes. As soon as I left Luke AFB in 2019, they installed a DEI office on base. Messages to "celebrate" identity groups were getting louder. Nothing good comes from this crap."

"I'm 20 year AF vet. Retired in 2017, so I have some buddies still enlisted. A few of them are great leaders, E-9s. Unfortunately they're being unofficially pushed towards retirement because they are the wrong race and gender. This is already having a massive domino effect, and I hate to say that it's going to get much worse in the coming years."

"18 years active duty, been medical my entire career, been to Iraq in '06, Bahrain, Kuwait, Norway, Sweden, and several other places. I'm not gonna lie when I say I'm having a hard time leading as an experienced clinician in the military. I'd say in the last 10 years, the military has drastically changed. I remember the don't ask, don't tell

policy. I don't care if you are gay, lesbian, trans, or whatever your race, religion, gender is; however, I do care when it affects me as a straight white male married to the same woman for 17 years, 4 kids with the same woman and I get reverse discriminated against because of that. We hear all this systemic racism that's happening, I've felt it as a straight white male the entire time I've been in. I've never been super political, but I've gotten to the point I want my kids to understand and I've been educating them on social media, the current state of the country, etc."

"I served for 33 years and just retired last year. This is partly why I cashed out. Promotions based on race is all I saw in the last couple of years. On another subject, I served in Iraq and Afghanistan with some true female warriors. They were awesome and hard core, however that was in a war where we had a huge advantage. A war that's coming with China, Russia, North Korea, and Iran all at the same time things will be vastly different for my female sisters. Hand to hand in the middle of the night in a trench will be what it is about. It always comes down to that. Not to mention the POW situations that will occur that will make the Hanoi Hilton look like Club Med. Can you imagine female prisoners in today's environment? Also, especially in the Air Force, there are numerous joint spouses who fly, are Commanders etc. If one gets captured especially if she is female. What will happen to her in Russia, China, North Korea or an Iranian POW camp? Will she be passed around to the troops in the field to be humiliated and videoed, and if the internet is still going, that video goes viral on purpose? No one is thinking about this at all."

"We were on our final ruck in basic before graduation. There was a recruit named rowe. Her feet were bowed out to the side, walked like a penguin. She couldn't keep up. DS Baker pulls me

from the front, I was flag guy. He says "look soldier we gotta quota to meet. she has to finish. And I'm making it your problem." They literally linked us together with 550 and I dragged this lady for a few miles! mind you my ruck was already 75lbs. I was salty, but we made it."

"It's so funny, the military propagates the women in combat arms discussion so religiously that hearing a grown up casually point out the obvious about feels like I'm committing an EEO violation for agreeing - even though most people privately agree 100% with what he is saying."

"20 year vet here. Yes, it is. To be clear, while I disagree with the gay lifestyle, I have served with gays, I've had two gay commanders, both of which were fantastic btw, and at the end of the day, whether I disagree with people or not, we're working on the same mission and we are all pulling together. However, when DE&I started to become a thing, when they started ramming down our throats how we didn't have to just tolerate people but celebrate depravity and lunacy, that's where they lost me... I've been told I'm a piece of trash because I'm male, because I look white, because I'm a Christian, because I'm straight, because I am a conservative... I've been told I'm a rapist, a racist, and an extremist, and that's all garbage... Meanwhile, I passed signs every day in my building for all kinds of events celebrating this group and that group and this other crazy thing. Not only am I completely left out of that, I am asked to celebrate things I don't agree with. I am asked to take time off mission to do it. I am asked to consider diversity above actual mission requirements. I am asked to make sure things look right rather than actually being right or effective. This is not sustainable, and if people think they're going to get the kind of performance that we used to get out of the military out of this mandatory celebration, diversity is our strength bullshit, they have another thing coming."

"I was in the army from 2013-2019, even in that timeframe I saw a lot of change. I left right as they were allowing women to get combat roles. It's dangerous because other countries / cultures do not respect women the same way we do in America and in the west. Women in combat roles could find themselves in very dangerous and traumatic situations that a man may not encounter."

"I almost got the boot after 16 years of service b/c I refused to use pronouns. That's when I knew, the military was over."

"My friend is being targeted for being straight and not wearing a pride flag where his American goes on his uniform."

"I got out just in time to avoid the wokeness. I have thought about going back in, but since the military adopted the opinion that masculinity is toxic, I have no desire for a return and neither do any of the others (men and women) I served with."

"Family member maxed ASVAB, had great grades, scored super high on PT (3rd best 3-mile run in nation) yet wasn't awarded the Marines OCS scholarship due to quotas, & flat out told that. So, good luck USA (go to hell) w/ the next war."

"There is a very good reason men do not want women in combat, and especially not in positions of military authority: men know they're supposed to protect and defend women, and that the military leader lays his life down for his men. And men do not want to sacrifice women or force them to take care of themselves. It has nothing to do with a lack of respect for women, or with any kind of misogyny. It's about common sense and natural male instinct to protect."

"As a veteran, descendant of many veterans. I have suggested to my kids and nieces and nephews, do

not join. It's truly sad and frustrating to watch what is happening to our Military."

"As a Navy Veteran who also still works for the Navy in civil service, I wholeheartedly agree with you."

"I got out on medical after 17 years. This government is so upside down that I couldn't finish my last three years in good conscience. I can't believe that I can no longer recommend military service to the next generation."

"I left the Department of the Army after having to attend mandatory transgender sensitivity training in 2018. I no longer recognize the country I love."

"I served in the military for 24 years. There is no way on God's green earth that I would recommend any young person to sign up for today's military. Too much woke and too many political generals who don't give a damn about the troops."

"I am not ashamed of my many years in the military service of my country. But, I wouldn't sign now if they offered me my own tank."

"I served 21 years in the Army. I talked my son out from enlisting in a WOKE military. Explain how being taught DEI prepares our military for combat."

"I left the Army in 2022 after serving 6 years. Even in that short time, I saw drastic changes that made it clear to me that it was a leftist institution that wasn't worth giving my time to."

"Got out of the Navy in 2020. The last 4-5 yrs the significant changes being made by top leadership made it clear things were going off the rails."

"Served 6 years as an Officer and recently left. I went in thinking this was the biggest honor of my life and wanted to do the hardest things possible to give back and give 20 years+. Fast forward to seeing people pushed through my Ranger graduation

because of numbers/ difficulty actually removing individuals from the course. Airborne school graduation with individuals standing next to me that fell out of every run, failed pullup test and overweight... Deployment being handcuffed to actually accomplish something...They just sucked any chance of pride from these accomplishments away were I could sit back and say "Damm, I actually did it". Lastly getting a chance to be an instructor and being forced to push individual's into the force AS LEADERS, I was done. You could not remove terrible applicants from the school house because it would fall apart in a pile of paperwork. Disrespectful to an NCO or Officer? No problem. Failed a PT test? No problem, try again. Horrible attitude? No issue, they passed minimum standards. Failed academic tests? No issue, recycle and try again. I am absolutely the demographic the Army wants. I couldn't be more patriotic, I couldn't have been more motivated and the Army killed all of that. I would never trade those years because of the people I met, but the institution is absolutely broken. If the Army is pushing people like me away, I do not know who they want."

"I was in 2006-2015, combat arms job in an airborne unit. I got out because I saw the writing on the wall. All of the time and energy allocated to pushing political and social concerns end up pulling away focus from war-fighting and readiness. Woke policies will undoubtedly fail on the battlefield, when that day comes I will be happy that I am out."

"9 years of military service - 3 years of defense contracting - - - thinking about service in TODAY's military - - - RUN the other way."

"I got out of the AF in 2010 and things were still fine then. But my friends who are still in, tell me that morale sucks everywhere and they're just trying to coast to retirement."

"As a recent retiree May 2023, the leadership I walked away from was an absolute shit show. An even bigger issue is the people they do manage to recruit are absolutely the softest most useless people I've seen my whole career. Out of 12 new technicians, only 2 of them were what I'd call "keepers". The old timers like myself propping them up are exiting at a unbelievable rate too. My TAPs instructor told us she had to increase the number of classes provided due to the amount of people punching out. It's gonna get really bad the next few years."

"I joined two years before you and retired in 17....I'm still associated with military as a JROTC instructor. I left because of how fast and far our standards slid. It's well off the cliff now. It's not bad...it was bad and getting worse. It's unacceptable and people in charge are in complete denial. At least publicly...the system is not designed for an internal fix. This is coming from the top and picked up steam with the 44th PODUS."

"I did ten years in the Navy and was HYT'ed (High-Year Tenure) back in 2021. One of the biggest strikes that I personally encountered was the automatic promotion (affirmative action) of sailors straight out of school that had no experience whatsoever making E-5/6. I went to my second command in WA back in 2017, checked in to my clinic coming from a major medical center, had my surface warfare pin, lots of experience, I was the only male in the clinic, was treated like dog shit, saw one female, straight from "C" school literally GIVEN promotion twice and went from E-4 to E-6 without lifting a finger, and yet I was told, "you still need to earn your promotion". That's when I realized that the Navy has an agenda."

"Most males in my family have served going back to the Revolutionary War and NONE of us recommend serving now. I go out of my way to tell people DONT DO IT. I was out in 2019 and I watched the 'Woke' politics strangle put the last bit of hope I had for the military. It's broken."

"I bailed because of this (woke in the military) and its far worse than people realize. Don't join any branch of service and just learn a trade. Absolute dumpster fire..."

"The supreme art of war is to subdue the enemy without fighting."

"I did 32.5 years and am so glad I am out. The military is an embarrassment. We can no longer go fight, kill, and win. Now they are worried about wholeness. I had a fellow Soldier in the Army transition from a female to male Soldier it was a nightmare. They were treated like a celebrity, they were the promised child."

"As a retired Air Force Vet I would discourage my children from entering the military: unless they become commissioned. However, even that may not be enough. Today's Military is not pushed or marketed to promote patriotism but more for wokeness and checking all these boxes for the sake of diversity. Another reason I think many aren't willing to enlist is the mandated Covid shot."

"After serving from 2013-to 2022, The Army became all about politics, the standards are not there anymore. We as NCO's can't enforce standards because the second we do is Hazing or the soldier will get their feelings hurt and the NCO gets their ass handed. Counseling's I lost track of how many hours I spend writing counseling's that were pointless, at the end of the day there had to be a trail and after spending all the time doing all that additional work and spending time away from my family, we get to 1SG

moure domestic Franquitty, provide

office just to have him give the soldier a weak tap on the wrist because he cant afford to lose soldiers. SO WE ARE KEEPING TRASH who are just there showing up daily to do THE BARE MINIMUM and get promoted before those of us who bust our ASS. Financially we don't get paid enough to be babysitting and losing my family, This creates a big mental health issue. As civilians we feel more appreciated and we actually get Paid. I have served with some of America's most Badass Mf's and I will forever Honor my brothers and sisters who have sacrificed so much for us."

"I was forced to medical retire because the AF didn't want to pay for a cheap drug every month in 1999 and now they are paying for breast enlargement surgery and sex reassignment surgery plus the very expensive multiple drugs they must take daily. And I had never missed a day of work or any deployment and I volunteered for all of them. Unreal what has changed in the once most feared fighting force on the planet."

"This is part of why I got out of the Marines in 2016. Shit was starting to be forced top down HARD. The feminist agenda was front and center."

"As long as Progressives hold the White House, America will continue to decline in all international spheres of influence and of course, domestically! On the military side of this post, a great young USN Captain I have known all of his life is leaving because of the DEI focus."

"I follow military-based accounts on various SM platforms. The substance and morale of the US military has been intentionally gutted. There's literally no one left in the entire command structure who's both ethical and competent and recruitment is at an all-time low. Further, military readiness is very low, much lower that reported due to corruption and incompetence. All the units lie about their readiness, e.g., the motor pool

reports 90% of its vehicles are ready to go when it's really 20%. That's going on everywhere."

"It's heart breaking. A lot of families, including my own, have served generation after generation. Imagine all the brothers and sisters we lost would say about the military today. So, I will do everything in my power to tell my son to NOT to fulfill that oath we all raised our hand for. From my family to any family out there that served, we had a hell of a run and I'm glad I served during and after the generations that stood for honor and commitment."

"My grandfather, brother, husband, and many uncles and cousins all served. My boys grew up wanting to serve and now they are not interested! Between the woke propaganda and lack of readiness, we see, I don't want them going to fight in a proxy war that our nation should have never been involved in from the beginning."

"Our son, who graduated before his 21st birthday with dual college degrees, is a staff sergeant in Special Forces, spent his Christmas leave caring for my husband and I during serious cancer and cardiac surgeries in December. While he was home with us, he showed me an email from the DOD, with a survey attached, asking if he felt he was able to do his job without harming the environment. Guess who's getting out."

"I served 30 years in the Army. The libs try to blame the job market and the number of young people qualified to serve. "My great grandfather served in WWI, my grandfather was in the Aleutians during WW2, My great aunt was a WAC, my dad was in Vietnam, my mom served 20 years, all of my siblings and I served (at different times) between 1979 and 2015. My oldest daughter served 4 years from 2001-2005. While I am very patriotic, and was extremely proud to serve, I will not encourage my youngest daughter or my grandchildren to serve at this point in history. US Army 1981-2008

"I saw an article in which a soldier said he and many of his fellow soldiers are discouraging and even outright denying their sons and daughters to enter the military. They don't want to see their children die for someone's ideology. You can ask a man to die for honor, for his fellow countrymen, for his God. But none of them will lay their lives down for a government that has shown it has no plans to protect the families they will be leaving behind."

"He is not alone. I know several military families. They have had at least one person in the military since they came to the US. In the case of one of the three families, that was since the revolutionary war. All three families have advised their younger members to not join. In two cases, members who were in the military have left. One resigned his commission, and the other refused reenlistment. My family has a history of every male member serving at least one enlistment. I have advised all three grand nephews to not enlist. The military has a decades long cycle of political generals messing everything up, and then war fighting generals coming in to fix it. This time I don't think it can be fixed."

"21 year veteran of the Air Force here...yes, we need to rekindle the warrior ethos back into our ranks. Too many useless distractions will get our soldiers, sailors, airmen, marines, coasties and guardians killed. I have three daughters and they

are not seeing the military as a future option or career path."

"I think he is a smart young man. I retired from the military, but I would not recommend anyone join it today, nor would I. The few are doing their best to ruin everything in our country for the majority of us and even force the majority to pay for everything and anything the minority wants."

"My son serves in the military and he told me that the enlisted do not trust anyone with the rank of 2nd Lt and above. The brass is seen as woke and political while not fully committed to the troops well being and readiness status. it usually left up to the individual combat soldiers to supplement their gear out of pocket to maintain personal combat readiness as best as they can. And they usually do a good job at it when allowed to."

"Afghanistan pull-out and woke policies were enough to turn my boys (18 and 20) away from service. As a former marine I completely agree with their decisions."

"DEI was bad in the military when I retired in '15. I know literally dozens of people who since have gotten out before retirement because they couldn't take it anymore."

"As a United States Marine who served this country for 8 years, from 98-2006, I am disgusted and ashamed of what's happened to our once great military. Just like EVERYTHING else they touch, the democrats are ruining it."

"My grandson was planning to join the military but after the Afghanistan debacle and the apparent politicization of the military decided not to join. He is a young man who finished college with a degree in computer science and cybersecurity. He would have been a terrific asset as an officer but the military leadership destroyed the ambitions and sense of security in the armed forces of young people. Something is wrong with the leadership of the military and is potentially dangerous for the country."

"When the U.S. military (even the Marines) has "diversity officers", aka commissars, you know all you need to know about why recruiting is horrible."

"I spent 22 years in the service. I definitely agree with last post which speaks to "woke" leadership. What is disconcerting is that I don't know if the senior officers actually believe the woke agenda or

are they just trying to please their master. In either case, it is a lack of principled leadership that has helped get us here."

"The most fundamental transformation to our republic that has come about this century is the success the left has had with transforming our nation into one that few would defend."

"We won't meet our recruitment goals until the current PC Generals leave the ranks. Instead of talking about warfighting, they talk about DEI, CRT, LGBTQ. Let's not forget that no one was fired for the Afghanistan debacle. As a 26 yr veteran, I wouldn't recommend signing up as many fellow veterans feel the same. All of a sudden potential recruits have discovered that the military isn't where the big money is made. All of a sudden....."

"I think we have a lost generation here with Gen Z. I read where these young people are so anxious they don't answer their phones. They obviously have not been prepared for the real world of competitiveness and harsh realities. The military hasn't helped their recruitment cause. Devising military programs to attract transgenders is very much at cross purpose to military doctrines. Leadership matters and when weak woke leadership comes from the top rung we all suffer the consequences of the mistakes made. No one escapes from real world consequences for very long."

"We built a society in which no one feels connected to anyone or anything. Everything is just about power and money these days. We used to care about our communities, our neighbors, our church, but now there's just the material world and everything is devoid of meaning or purpose. People my father's age - didn't go around "thanking" each other's for their service - instead it was: "What did you do in the war?" Military service also instills a love of country and civic mindedness. People tend to care about that with which they have investment. And - one other thing - for young men, military service teaches you that you are nothing special. You get cold, hungry, scared, lonely - just like the next guy. That is an invaluable lesson for a young man to learn, at a point in life when most boys think the world revolves around them. The military knocks that down real quick and teaches responsibility, commitment, teamwork at an age when most kids today are just iPhone obsessed narcissists!"

"As a third generation career military officer (retired) I would not recommend a military enlistment to any of my family. What was once proud organizations providing the legitimate defense of our nation has become a political tool for the indoctrination of our youth and country. We send our troops to all corners of the world to stick America's nose into issues that have no relevance to our national security and defense. We are not the world's policeman. A review of the countries that were once under the control of our current enemies (Russia and China) shows a profound hatred of those countries once freed. Our first president George Washington warned of entangling alliances and the application of "favored nation" to countries of the world. Army intelligence veteran: "These wars of choice by the United States have nothing to do with our defense and everything to do with America maintaining and extending its empire across the globe. The wars are not meant to end as we leapfrog from one to another. The goal is to keep the money flowing to the military-industrial complex and the oligarchs in our country that control it. It's not about freedom, democracy, Mom, and apple pie as I've stated many times before. "For a generation that has grown up in a time of American Imperialism, endless wars, multiple economic crises, and declining hope for a future like their parents, it's not shocking that Pro-American sentiment is at an all-time low. To many young people, the military is seen as just a meat grinder that doesn't offer the same incentives it once did. I see a lot of people complaining about the military being too "woke" and I'm sure for some that's the case, but for many others it's seen as a brutal force of imperialism that lacks all of the ideals that I see older generations describing it as. The military as such faces a two sided problem: to

"Would you join an organization that routinely sends you to the far reaches of the world to be shot at, killed, maimed, and insulted by forcing you to fight with self-imposed handicaps then brings what's left of you home and abandons you to whatever charity agrees to help you out? And oh by the way, the places where you fight are no better off when you leave than they were before? Not to mention the emphasis on whatever crazed politics happen to be currently in vogue?" --Navy veteran, medical doctor

"Today is 2 years since the Afghan debacle. Biden is the cause of that fiasco that killed 13 young service members. When they came home, coffins passing, Joe is looking at his watch. Military family here and we advised our children not to join."

"After two decades of "forever" wars in Afghanistan and Iraq, the next generation takes a serious look at serving in the military and says "Naw, I think I'll pass". Good for them."

In response to a left-leaning young person's comment:

"Wokeism is an ideology that classifies and treats people based on principles of (1) identity politics and (2) an oppressor-oppressed dynamic. Identity politics differentiates people based on various identity "markers" - race, ethnicity, sex, gender identification, immigration status, etc. The oppressor-oppressed dynamic differentiates people based on whether they are oppressors or oppressed. Wokeism combines these two principles to create the concept of intersectionality, under which people can have overlapping identities that affect their standing in society. The numerous

possible permutations of intersecting identities, combined with the ever-evolving identities imagined by wokesters, can obviously complicate the rankings of the members of the oppressed class. Finally, wokeism is authoritarian in that it believes in imposing its ideology on people, by coercion (see, e.g., cancel culture) or by force (see, e.g., lawless activity to suppress speech that is deemed inconsistent with wokeness). Wokeism obviously runs afoul of various, longstanding principles of American life, history, and law (such as section 1 of the Fourteenth Amendment to the U.S. Constitution), but that appears to be of no concern to wokesters and their enablers, including their many enablers in the Democratic Party."

nation and supposedly protecting our country's allies (whom appear to be slinking away one-byone). I would not, will not, cannot propose military service as an option for young people today. "The Washington Post stated, "For the academies, which educate and train future military officers, racial diversity is a crucial matter. "If Feaver is one of the people the military is hiring to figure out what the issue is he is failing miserably. No one wants to join due to all the woke policies."

"Newsflash: know your target market. Military leaders are playing politics and pandering to woke culture while abandoning their core recruiting population...not too hard to figure out."

"Veterans as a group are one of the most important recruiters. Almost all my fellow members at my veteran's organization (the largest in the US) feel the same. You would be hard pressed to find a member who still recommends military service today, that wasn't the case a couple years ago."

"I'm retired military 21 yrs. I would not join todays military with the liberal administration and liberal officers running the military today. would not recommend joining to anyone right now. need to purge liberal influence."

"Won't allow my grandson to serve!! The fact that Corps saved my life but this ain't the Marine Corps or leadership that had!!"

"My family has a long tradition of service and when my grandson began discussing enlisting it really reinforced my concerns about this administration for a number of reasons. Besides incompetence in any number of areas including leadership, national, international, economic, defense, crime and educational policies, this administration appears to be living in a bubble that lacks self awareness and consists of only those with the same extreme views.

This administration doesn't know its audience, the American people and how disastrously those policies affect everyday Americans. Those who serve generally come from strong family backgrounds with strong values and belief in America. How can this administration support "woke" policies in every corner of American life and expect our best young people to make the sacrifices of serving when their service and sacrifices are not valued?

At schools and universities the teacher's union and its minions daily bombard our youth with the message that America and all its institutions are bad. That the American family is bad. That race is the overarching benchmark through which all things must be viewed and judged. Honor, strength, justice, valor, they don't seem to be the foundation anymore. the core values have literally been replaced. The values that families joined generation by generation have been eroded....and yes by wokeness. So once those chains are broken, they will be nearly impossible to put back together. Impossible. My daughter made it to almost going to OCS for the Marines. Then she changed course. o much sticking it out through all the medical holds and information inquires she started to wonder what is she putting her life on the line for with Biden as CIC. She switched and walked away and now says it was the best choice she could have made. some members of our family were sad but they knew it wasn't the same military they were in. As long as they continue to deny this, the problem will just grow."

"I first enlisted when Reagan was CINC. I retired when BO was in the white house. When people in leadership believe in our nation, its history & values, recruitment increases. When leaders denigrate our heritage, criticize our history, & claim America is an evil nation, systemic racism is rampant, & we are guilty of many genocides, (as both BO & Brandon have always done) patriotism & national pride wane, & nobody is willing to join the military to defend the nation. When I retired, my retirement certificate was signed by BO, & it has no value to me. Wish I could have waited til President Trump was commander in chief."

"These people will find any excuse other than the truth to avoid hurting their narrative. People don't realize the real damage being done to our military

and national security because of woke policies. woke policies that include Men coming to work dressed as women. woke policies that lead to a decline in patriotism and lack of appreciation for the flag and its meaning. kids being taught that the US is a horrible post colonial racist state. NOT serve in the military. It is, without question, a contributor to declining recruiting numbers. I would not recommend my grandchildren serve while the current mindset of the military is not primarily on true readiness."

"You know, my youngest son and I were both Army officers. He started as a Private and retired after 23 years as a Major. The Army sent him to an Ivy League college to get his masters degree. He commanded convoys from Kandahar to brigade FOBs and COPs. He ended up in Iraq for a tour as a Federal Contracting Officer. When I asked him why he was retiring kind of early, he replied "Dad, you wouldn't want to be in today's Army". Why do you suppose he said that?"

"I think this so called expert is wrong. Military retirees and other veterans are encouraging their kids to stay out of the service. That's a huge source of recruits. I know that I don't want my sons to serve under the current conditions. This expert also says that the DEI and other woke training time is low. He's missing the point. It's the policies that are implemented that are 24-7-365."

"Oddly enough I find myself in that group. I never thought I'd be. Three generations of family served in both world wars, the Korean War, the first Gulf War and me in the second go around. "What military aged white male would want to enlist when politicians made it clear to promote Blacks and women over more experienced white men? I smell a Diversity, Equity & Inclusion quota system being used in the liberal social engineering degeneration of our military."

"I'm a retired veteran. I don't trust the military one bit."

"By the second, and last, sacking of Rome in 476, few in the legions were actually Roman, being conscripts from the provinces whose loyalties lay elsewhere, and volunteers for whom it was just a paycheck. "Is there any doubt that this misguided liberalism has infiltrated our military? As a retiree I am so appalled at how politicized our military has become. God help us all if we find ourselves in an all-out war. We might have good service members who can fight but they won't be led by the best."

"As a veteran, myself..... I am thoroughly disgusted by how our military is playing politics and favorites with the political process."

"My dad is a retired AF Brigadier General (pilot), and retired in 1994. My brother-in-law is a retired AF Colonel (pilot), and his dad is also a retired AF Brig. General (pilot). They are all so glad they retired long before any of this non-sense started."

"My dad is a retired Army Master Sargent, and I'm a navy vet. We both feel the same way, and we're both glad that my service-age sons have no interest in joining."

"Retired USAF Lt Col here. The politicized military by government bureaucrats is not the Air Force I served in. Military members must always beware, in or out of uniform, not to bring discredit upon the service. However, off-duty political affiliation is 100% protected by the 1st Amendment of the

"These were the intelligent and the free who left. They made the right decision. They will not return to where they were humiliated by those who don't love freedom and embrace socialism like today's army."

"I'm currently in the Army and there are huge issues that aren't tolerable. But being this close to 20 year retirement is the only incentive keeping me in. I've seen several amazing and young leaders under toxic leadership after their first contract they get out. I've seen women falsely accuse men of rape and they get captured out dishonorable. There is no investigation, it's pretty much if anyone accuses you of sex crime you did it. Women are incentivized to accuse men of misconduct to get transferred to new duty stations it happens a lot. The army doesn't protect or stand for men at all anymore. The quality of terrible soldiers that they allow to graduate from basic training is terrible I'm afraid. for being on their phones, and the leadership was there to support those who cause trouble when they couldn't have it their way. The military today is nothing like it should be. The United States couldn't win a war today with the soldiers they have, it's very sad."

"When I started hearing of the current recruiting crisis, my first thought is they must be having issues with recruiting the next gen from currently serving or veteran families. None of this should be a surprise to leadership. They know why. They just want us to do their homework and help them find the language they can weaponize to gaslight the next gen. Because they have no intention on fixing squat. Panels like this are just a way of entering \$\$\$ amounts under "programs and services" provided (legal accounting trick). That's not a joke. My husband and I are both Navy veterans. All three of our kids were born while on AD. All came of age within the last 10 years, and despite our careers in the Navy being a good life during the 90s and 00s, I threw down about any of our children joining up with any branch. If the children of veterans and a retired veteran no longer have faith who is going to defend our freedoms."

"I am a retired Navy Commander with 30 years of Active Duty Service (4 enlisted 26 as an officer). I

started out in the Carter years, 76 to be exact and came back in during the Reagan buildup until 2012. I am as ardent a patriot and supporter of the military as anyone, in fact probably more having spent half my life in it. BUT, today I encourage no one to join.

In my days homosexuality was a reason to get kicked out, but I do not remember anyone suffering this fate. In fact, I had several people over the years that were most likely gay, but it didn't matter as in fact they were some of my most competent sailors. I do not encourage not serving because of this, as I said they were hard workers.

The reason I do not encourage service is DemocRATS allowing Transgenders to serve. Why? Because Gender Dysphoria is a mental illness. "I'm in the Army, been in for 18 years, and have worked as a recruiter. The poll that shows that the military is "too woke" is accurate so many people within the military feel this way... and the people that actually get other people to think about the military on a large scale, are not recruiters but other people in the military that talk about their experience to friends and family. - "How about we teach something crazy like how to win battles...."
- "All that crap goes out the window when facing the enemy. It has no place in our military preparedness."
- "This is Bravo Sierra. Teach them how to shoot straight and kill the enemy."
- "Halsey and Nimitz are rolling over in their graves. We are now totally incapable of waging and winning a full scale war."
- "The US Navy is screwed."
- "Too bad they can't teach them to be leaders of victories."
- "The world is laughing at what has become the American Military."
- "They wonder why recruitment is down.
   Who wants to join a dysfunctional military."
- "What person of talent and skill is likely to pursue a career with any organization whose leadership is so eager and willing to embrace absurdity? What person of talent wants to work for an organization where you have to navigate this minefield of distorted reality knowing that one wrong step can lay waste to a career and person's personal and professional reputation. Talented people will go where their abilities can flourish while those who spend their days seeking to be affirmed by others for their distorted grasp of reality will do what they do best... they'll get promoted up the ranks."

"My son got a degree in geology. He used to be interested in the military but the politics, the wokeness has changed his mind. I'm sure many feel the same."

"Retired from the Army after 30 years and seeing how they treated my son during Covid, the mistrust of senior leaders from the Afghan retreat debacle, the apparent stressing of diversity over merit, and letting people who deny the reality of their own body join and then force others live with and accept their delusions-he is quitting and warning others not to join. I have to agree with him."

"I have served 34 total years, with 4 of those in combat/combat zones. I absolutely would direct all of America's youth to NOT serve under this America-hating, military-hating, woke Marxist democrat regime."

"I currently serve as a senior NCO and have had to deal directly with the woke agendas being forced down our throats. I wrote a paper discussing the backlash over these policies in an NCOs school and was met with criticisms from fellow leaders for not being open and stuck in old traditions. Our traditions are what have kept this country free for over two hundred years, and I will not be selling my fellow Soldiers out to make woke politicians and insane activists happy."

"I left after 21 years when the CO of our garrison decided to make PT 'optional' because so few soldiers were even bothering to go."

"I served 27 years in the US Army. My father served 20 years in the USMC. We'll be the last in our family to serve. I have 3 sons. None of them will join and I am the reason why. I have specifically told them the current US Military is dishonorable and an unworthy organization. Two are serving in the JSDF and the last will join in a little less than 2 years. "I bailed as soon as I hit my 20-year point in 2004 because political correctness was seeping into everything. I can only imagine how bad it is now."

"I'm a 20+ year vet. Frankly, poor top-down leadership in both our Government and military brass, along with the woke nonsense (DEI, identity politics, pronouns, drag queens, over indulgence on abortions, vaccinations and transgender policies, etc,) and the systemic indoctrination of our youth through social media and liberal school programs that literally promote anti-American sentiment are to blame. "My wife and I are both combat veterans, joining in 1981, retiring in 2006 and probably wouldn't join the military the way it us now."

"I retired Army in 2012. I tell every young person that asks me my opinion to stay as far away as possible. They are not serving a nation or

protecting freedom. They are serving a corrupt government."

"After 28 years in the military our present military in most cases is not a real military but indoctrinating our soldiers and not training them to fight. I would not recommend any young person join out present military."

"A respectable and honorable career, has been diminished by many politicians who fight for injustices and diversity, over American historical values, and the view that America is a force of good. Not a good path we're on."

"My family has had someone from every generation in uniform for every war this nation has ever been in, officers (as high as General - Army), enlisted (a couple of Master Chiefs, five Sergeant Majors - various). We had historically been in one uniform or another for nearly 350 years (US, British, French, even Mexican). We have never gone more than 15 years, until now, without someone serving, Navy, Air Force, Army, Marines even a Coastie. Currently the "old guard", the old farts (and a few fartesses - their term) are not suggesting military as a path, we just don't trust the political leadership to do the the right thing. And that phrase means something to the military community, it goes beyond politics. Many contemporary kids and young adults, the same type of kids that would have volunteered years ago, aren't interested in pronouns, being lectured by hypocrites, or being taught CRT. The Army that we all dreamed about and role-played as kids needs to be rebuilt. Recruiting takes care of itself if you're not thumbing your nose at your base."

"The inclusion of women in some physically demanding programs, once again lowering standards, has watered down the selection process where you end up accepting candidates who previously would NOT have passed. This hurts unit morale!"

"The military purged religious members and many real god fearing and exceptional loyal soldiers. The result will be felt for decades. Coming from a retired LTC."

"I work on an AFB and the Airmen are getting weaker every year. They need things wrapped around their self-esteem, rather than acting to solve their own problems. There are a few standouts, but on the whole there's a general lack of initiative even when one spells out their various options. It's "You can do XYZ without my help," with which they answer, "But that's too hard!"

"I'm a military veteran. A neighbor child asked me about joining the military and I told him he should probably not at this time until there are some changes for the better. If that ever happens, of course."

"As an Army vet, the answer to low numbers is so obvious. Look at the recruiting messages and the reality that young patriots don't want any part of a woke military. Young patriots don't want to fight for an equity America where talent and hard work are no longer recognized."

"My father, 4 brothers and I served in the USMC. My younger brother served in the U S Army. I recommended my son not to serve. Our once great military is a complete woke joke and has not been involved in any fighting that has benefitted our great country in many decades."

"My daughter was going in after college. Her friends who are already in recommended her not to enlist. They said they waste so much time of woke policies. They are upset at the pronoun policies, and men are allowed to wear dresses."

"I have a retirement date in mind after 30 years of service, the only reason I don't retire immediately

is I couldn't stand to have this President sign my retirement! I collect a few more paychecks in the meantime and earn slightly more of a retirement payment until I retire with someone's name and signature I can respect on my "Presidential Letter."

"I retired from the Army in 2014 after twenty years of service. When service members retire they get two signed certificates. One is from the serving POTUS, and the other is from the Army Chief of Staff. Pres Obama signed one, and Gen. Raymond T. Odierno signed the other. Guess which one hangs on my wall and the other in a box in the attic somewhere."

"The leadership of the military is now woke, they started turning about a decade and a half ago. I had 23 years in and got out when it started really going bad. "The military started losing applicants when they started going woke. They have shot themselves in the foot. "My husband is a West Point grad and I was an Army wife. I dreamed of one of my daughters following in their father's footsteps. No more. I would never let any of my children serve in this military. I refuse to let them die for the Rainbow Brigade."

"Count me in that group. Retired Navy officer, son of a retired Air Force CMSGT, brother of another. Our immediate family has a century of military service. It ends here. My son didn't enlist, and his daughters never will."

"We are a Marine Corps family. There is no way I would encourage any young man to become a Marine today. And that hurts me."

"Our Pastor's son got a basketball scholarship and went to West Point last year. He lasted one semester and had to get outta there. He said it was so woke that he didn't trust anyone if we end up going to war somewhere. A complete s- show. So disillusioning."

"I am also a veteran of the 82nd airborne, and I will not have any of my children serve in the military... And I would encourage anyone who's thinking of enlisting in the military of not making that fatal mistake of dying for some "woke" cause...to make others rich."

"I felt proud to serve because of my father. My children choose to serve for their own reasons. I will try to change my grandchildren's mind if they consider serving. 50 years of military service comes to an end. This country has fallen so far beyond belief."

"Every male in my immediate family that was eligible to serve, served, going back as far as we can remember. My youngest bro. Just retired from USAF. That streak is over. We all STRONGLY discourage any talk of service. We generally won't even discuss our service around them."

"I served 30 years AC. I was Recruiter of the Year in the 90s at Company, Battalion, and Brigade level. I also convinced some kids at church later in my career. Both my sons enlisted. For the last 3 years I've gone 180. I've convinced about 12 young men not to join."

"I have two kids in the Army. They want out so bad now they are regretting re enlisting."

"I'm a former commissioned officer with honorable discharges from both the Army and the Air Force. Sadly, there is NO WAY that I would advise a young person to swear an oath to this current corrupt commander-in-chief. And that goes for the senior officers of the Pentagon too!"

"My husband retires from the Air Force with a 20 year career in less than 2 years and it can't come soon enough. Wokeness is an infection rotting it from the inside out. Good airmen no longer get promoted due to the strat program. White men are time and time again looked over to meet diversity goals regardless of their achievements."

"As a Hispanic and former senior naval officer, I have never been offended by names of military bases and hardly think any military officer is. Military personnel should always be promoted based on their performance and knowledge not the color of their skin or gender as so many are today. I separated from the military under the Obama administration because of their woke agenda changing the readiness of the military. Today's military is not the same military I joined and that is scary."

"As a combat veteran and whose son is on active duty now, we are ashamed of what our beloved military has become."

I'm seeing people that don't know their jobs being inserted into leadership positions based solely on race, gender, and sexual preference. It honestly sickens me and thank god I'm nearing retirement. being a straight white male in the military. Flame me if you want I don't really care but it's true. I will 10000000% keep both of my children from joining the military in the future. If you're reading this I STRONGLY encourage you do the same. I have lived this life and the regrets faarrrr outweigh the benefits.

"My Dad worked for the Coast Guard as an electrician. This was back in the 60's, 70's & 80's. He was self-taught to become an electrician doing the electrical repairs on Military ships. He got passed over for promotion 3 times for a younger black less than knowledgeable ppl. He had to constantly review and fix what they messed up. These aren't ships that can afford to have electrical problems on mission. He complained about it and got passed over again. However, he was not going to let our seamen go out there and get stranded, so he kept doing his job and theirs."

"10 year Army veteran. Agree there have always been elements of this but it has gotten so much worse. I'm the 90s the military still maintained an air of impartiality where politics was concerned. In fact, in private conversations there were plenty of conservatives. I now work as a civ around military and I can tell you that is not the case anymore. It is blatant and it is disgusting. It is why recruitment among whites is plummeting."

"I'm a minority, spent 30 years on active duty and don't recall a single moment where my race played a part in my promotions, it never worked for or against me as it was all based on ability. Today's DEI requirements are a joke and an insult to qualified personnel."

"I was seeing this in the Army before I got out in 2007. People getting priority and promotions based purely on their race, and it wasn't white. It's the biggest reason I got out. I had better scores, better PT tests, attitude, etc. and it just didn't matter."

"We were given a class back years ago by a senior officer that served as the head of the promotion board one year. He talked about how aviators were selected for promotion. First the list was generated based on their performance files... Then the "rack and stack" began. People were moved around, and rightly so, based on the needs of the airframe. By that I mean if the first 50 names on the list to CW3 were Blackhawk and Chinook pilots and the Army needed more Apache CW3s then those top Apache pilots would move up into the list. After all that happened they then went back and racked and stacked based on color so that there was more "diversity" on the final promotion list. He said that then meant that of the first African American Apache guy was no. 100 on the list he would then move up passed all others to be promoted not based on his performance or Army needs but rather his skin color."

"When I was a recruiter for the Navy, we, including the other branches, had diversity goals. We had and still do have black upper mental group, hispanic upper mental group, Pacific islander upper mental group (which was Asian, Indian, etc, WINTR (women in non-traditional traditional ratings). Upper mental group is anyone who gets 50 and above on Asvab. We didn't have a white goal. As a matter of fact, we didn't make a goal if we didn't find a certain amount of the above ethnicity goals. So no matter if I had 25 white upper mental group men ready and QUALIFIED to join, unless a percentage of that 25 was not ethnicity, I missed goal and could not put them all on. Let's call it how it is, the military/government did this to themself."

"My father served in the Army for 23 years. I served in the Army for 21 years. I would not recommend my children serve today. And that's sad."

"I graduated USMA in 1983. Special recruiting and retention criteria were absolutely in force. I guestimate about 33% each across special recruiting for blacks, women and athletes. Retention was entirely focused on women and blacks. White, Latino, and Asian men got or no special attention when they failed. Women and blacks got multiple tries. One woman tried to kill herself over stress 5 or 6 times and rather than removal on a psych basis they fought to retain her. Yup that's the kind of person you want making life and death decisions."

"I actively dissuade people from joining. I was almost killed in 2011 when a diversity hire f'ed up and froze. Now that the military focuses on it, I cannot in good conscience give support towards our youth joining with the current leadership and military values in place."

"This [fast-attack] submarine veteran calls bullshit on DEI in the military; a submarine could NEVER be nearly affective as they are without merit-based crews; anyone who claims their lethality is in their weapons has never been IN the fleet and has ZERO clue in what submarines do [talking about fastattack, not the boomers]."

"Being retired from the military and having access to different bases, I have seen a huge decline in the base infrastructure, appearance, and mostly the attitude. Our current administration really just doesn't care."

"I just retired after 21 years of service in the Army and I will not recommend anyone to join the Army. This is a great example of what DEI has done to ruin our military, especially the ARMY."

"Trust in our government is at an all-time low. My son was up for reenlistment but my brother, a USMC Colonel, and myself discouraged him from doing so. Like a lot of parents and family members we don't want our precious children dying in wars brought on by a politically rotten and corrupt president that currently sits in the White House."

"Our current government has labeled all white men White Supremacists, domestic terrorists, and blamed for every wrong in the world. The real question is: Why WOULD a white man voluntarily die for this government? I served 30 years in the Army, but I would not recommend for any white person to join this military."

"Retired after 27 years...not aligning to the woke Army or one misstep can mean no promotion and removal...especially for officers. REMOVED for Nonselection for promotion to LTC. Yes, white male."

"I was in the Army, both my sons are in the Army. What a conversation we have, on all that has changed for the worse."

"Over 20 years active duty and my bride a vet as well, discouraged our kids from joining and would not recommend to anyone in its current state. Very sad times."

"I spent 24 years in the USAF. I wouldn't recommend the military to anyone. It's a politically correct nuthouse nowadays."

"The folks that pushed this CRT stuff and woke agenda of inclusion that has infected our schools and even our military is destructive for morale and integrity of our soldiers. I served in the Army, and it was one place where there was no division, as each would give their life for the other. You will never find the folks who demanded their radical agenda to be part of our armed forces in uniform, serve their country, or even honor our flag, so I too would never recommend enlisting in the Army."

"Go WOKE and go broke. People are seeing the results of our current military leadership and are saying, "Nope." I retired after 30 years of service, and if I had to do it today, I would choose another career path. I guess the draft may be on the horizon."

"All we wanted was to survive when I was in Vietnam, no one cared about race, religion or what you believed in as long as you stood up and did your duty."

"As a retired Army NCO that served from 1984 -2004, i saw racial quotas in promotion of E6 - E8. Those days you had to have an official photo in dress uniform in a promotion packet. The excuse was to see if you looked physically fit, but it was also to see what ethnicity you were. The promotion boards were given quotas on which they were to promote each year. I worked for some of these quota promotions and some were functionally illiterate. Getting monthly counseling from them was a challenge to say the least. Some were also not proficient in our job skills either."

"Junior enlisted make up approximately half of the armed services. They should trot out a squad of these folks and ask the same questions. I guarantee the answers would not be welcomed by the left. My mission in the Army was pretty clear and DEI had no bearing on my readiness. What did have a bearing on my readiness were the hours upon hours of required training that had nothing to do with my job or readiness in general that 100% took away from the mission. Even as a young soldier, I recognized that it was completely unnecessary and a huge waste of time and resources."

"I have dropped my voluntary retirement request for Oct 2024 because the military has gone woke! Every freakin week or month you have training about Sexual Assaults, equality, trans, inclusion. It has become so politicized. We don't care what your skin color, just do your damn job-- cause you can't then I get stuck with it."

"180 degrees from what my Army was in the 1980's and 90's. This is one the reasons my son is leaving the Army Officer Corps. No longer in the business of war fighting as he put it."

"My daughter is USMC and will probably not renew but she is grateful for the training she's receiving. If she didn't develop tachycardia issues (possibly jab related due to the requirements of her having to get it) she might have looked at extending. She tells me she doesn't think they'll let her re-up with a heart condition. Even though its their fault she acquired one. Stupid mandates."

"My son was bumped out of VMI because of quota expectations. Not because of his academics. The letter stated he could try again for the next year but the Institute required a percentage of diversity applicants. What we have done is tell our youth that here in America you can be and do what ever you want if you work hard enough. What is actually happening is if you fit a certain criteria you will be put ahead of the line and pampered to ensure your success and you don't have to work hard to get there. And we wonder what has happened to our youth, and young leaders. Agreed, definitely a sad day!"

"A good friend of mine was told to his face "we are not looking for OCS candidates of your ethnicity. We are looking for an Asian American and an African American." Recruiter didn't even hide it. The conversation stopped right there. Refuses to entertain the idea of putting my buddy in. We sat there blown away."

"As a retired black 28 year special forces SGM; what does diversity have to do with qualification and assessment to become a pilot etc."

"My friend's son was initially denied a USAF WSO spot graduating from Purdue with a EE summa cum laude degree because he's Asian. All the slots went

to Black and Latino graduates regardless of their major or GPA. He was later offered (and accepted) a WSO slot when, presumably, they could not fill enough of the slots with MORE diverse (you, know, more diverse than Asian or Caucasian) hires."

"As a black AF vet, too many of my fellow blacks could not pass the qual test to be pilots in the first place. And those that could wouldn't elect to be pilots anyway. Most would pick career fields away from aviation and the rest would only join for college assistance."

KJP wasn't wrong when she thanked our military for "serving this administration." Our military leaders celebrate all of the wrong things. Only a few years ago the ONLY things worth celebrating were duty, honor, and country; were integrity, service, and excellence; and victory in conflict. Everything else is a distraction. When the wicked rule the people mourn."—Lt Col Matthew Lohmeier

"All 3 of my teenage sons are interested. Two are aspiring pilots and the other plane mechanics. The benefits for education are huge. As a homeschooling family, financial demands can be a strain. But I can't imagine sending them off to illegal, immoral war."

"I find myself not wanting to agree, but every time I think it out that's what I conclude as well. It's sad. It's scary for our country."

"Our 2 active duty kids helped convince youngest to drop her ROTC scholarship after the AFGH debacle. I will forever be grateful to them."

"Those of us who were career military and had their kids follow them in...we are now just hoping they don't try to retire and GTFO as soon as they can. I am praying mine just get out alive...literally."

"USMC vet, I absolutely would NOT recommend anyone joining today's military, especially under current CIC."

"My nephew is an Air Force pilot and we hear about the "wokeness" that has penetrated the military. The Coast Guard has parked 10 Cutters and closed 29 stations that they cannot staff. We are beyond in trouble."

"There will be a day in the very near future when this nation will regret that we have done to our military."

"Reminds me of Jack Nicholson's diatribe in 'A Few Good Men' that 'You can't handle the truth' . It was

quite a masterpiece. We will doubtless be reminded of it in the future when the latest military intakes run away from harm's way rather than towards it or are just wiped out a far better trained and selected force. I expect that the Roman army when through a woke phase just before the Empire failed."

"I served for 28 years, and he's right. It started with Clinton's "don't ask" policy. I noticed a declining morale whenever a democrat president took over. Those policies do make it down to the lower ranks. The Generals (and other officers) acted like politicians."

"Worked over 30 years for the military. Saw this deterioration starting around 2010. Glad I retired shortly thereafter. Obama is the cause. It all started with him. "I joined the US Navy in 1978 with the intent of making a career of it. Four years later, I declined to re-enlist. The reason that I did so was because they started allowing women to be posted on Navy combat ships. I felt then that by doing so there would be compromises made that would create a division between men and women from the standpoint of performance requirements as well as dissipate cohesion of the units and distractions from the tasks to perform while on duty. There are many examples that can be found which supports my assertion that I was right. Just looking for the rate of sexual harassment claims and pregnancies on ships will support my assertion. A woke military is even worse."

"My good Friend was Navy on the USS Yellowstone, aka 'The Love Boat' as so many female sailors came back from deployment very pregnant."

"I served over 21 years on active duty and what I saw essentially parallels what Hegseth is reporting! The problem is not the line troops, but rather with corrupted leadership, starting at the very top!"

"I entered the AF in 1970. When I retired in 95, we, the US, still had the capability to fight two major conflicts simultaneously. Today, I'm worried if we could even fight one. I see our stockpiles, manpower, and industrial base depleted. Then to top that all off, I see the leadership, both active duty and civilian, trying to score points with whatever is the newest thing coming out of the woke world. Not a good look for our military."

"As a disabled Combat Veteran with almost 24 years' service I simply cannot recommend military service to any young person right now. Today's "leaders" are a joke. "I was a fourth generation military member but I steered all of my children away from the military. "DEI is destroying Civil Air Patrol in California. My daughter just joined CAP. I was in from 1979 to 83 It is nothing like when I was in. They have said they do not believe in the concept of Esprit De Corps. Everything is about the minority individual. They are consumed with promoting minorities over all else. They have cadets that have been in the program 4 or 5 months and are already Senior Chief Master Sergeants. What can be done to fix this? It's crazy there is open contempt for white males."

"My husband and I have been disgusted with this. We both served over 25 years in military, and we have lost faith with everything."

"I've been currently active duty US Army and have been for a long time. The change in the army in the last 4 years has been extreme, we have now weekly classes on LGBTQ, diversity, inclusive and all the rest. These classes are used over range time, so instead of firing our weapons and learning to be efficient, we have classes. As an officer I'm being forced to make our enlisted learn this instead of their jobs. No one can speak out as we get ostracized and even forced out. The real state of our ground forces are in a terrible way."

"Amen, brother. Same boat in the AF. You will get destroyed (UCMJ) if you don't unquestioningly accept this nonsense. As an officer, you are required to even advocate for it to troops. The Fauci ouchy was the same way."

"I serve currently and have 28 years this year and the military since 2020 has been spiraling out of control. I will retire at my 30 year mark and can't wait and am sad that the legacy I leave is in total disarray."

"I am retired USAF (27 years). I am thoroughly embarrassed, for the military and our nation. This helps no one, but our adversaries. Lord help us all."

"Also retired USAF here (20 years). I don't think you'd find a retiree who doesn't agree with you."

"I am 21 year veteran and I totally agree with you."

"26 years USA and it saddens me deeply and you stated very succinctly, "LORD help us all"."

"I am retired USN, 20 years. I could have stayed longer than 20 but I had to go. I saw this crap coming 10 years ago. July 2013, at a command within the DMV, we had a meeting telling us a man was going to be legally allowed to use female spaces. This was 2 months AFTER the mandatory DoD-wide sexual harassment training. My comment was all that training was done for nothing if we are going to allowed women being harassed by this dude 'because he feels like a woman.' BS. The only reason I didn't fight it was because I was retiring in less than 30 days and couldn't get in trouble or that date delayed."

"10 years on active duty and this is a huge reason why I got out. The military is diverse without forcing it, no reason to force these woke ideologies in an organization where it doesn't add value to, but I can sure make the argument where it takes value away."

"Talked my daughter out of the military. She's a jr at UK and doing well. My son won't be seeing the military either."

"As a vet with multiple sons, I advised them to steer clear of the modern military."

"As a vet I would not allow or advise any young kid to join the military."

"I am a veteran who used to promote that my kids serve in the military. However, I have since encouraged them to do other things. This new country I live in is no longer America. These new leaders do not represent me."

"I grew up in the 80's. We grew up in a traditional Hispanic home. My father was a big Ronald Reagan fan. We were brought up to love America and love the Military. I was amazed of how incredible our country was. I joined the military and see it as one of the most proudest and enjoyable moments in my life. Now it makes me sad what the U.S., and military has turned into in the last 3 years."

"Husband is retired Navy and we do not want our sons in the current military."

"I'm so glad I retired out in 2011 and done my time in Iraq and Afghanistan when combat unit was still men, and the camaraderie was still great."

"I left active-duty army in 2017, after 11 years and 4 deployments. Thank God I got out."

"Same here. Joined in may 2007 got out 2018 so same amount of time as you roughly and after seeing how things have gone it makes me glad I'm not a part of it anymore."

"I was in the Air Force 24 years, if I saw something like this during my tenure I would immediately request a discharge! I could not find the energy to lift my right hand to salute this deranged officer. I told both my sons to avoid the military because of this woke BS...thankfully they heeded my advice."

"Literally dreamed of going into the military my entire childhood. Finally ready to enlist as an officer and there's just no way. It's so depressing to feel the loss of direction."

"This is why I got out of the military, I joined in 2020 of January and got out in July of 2023. It was total mess, and even had formation meetings about what you couldn't say to trans, bi, minorities and all, and I couldn't believe that I was given lecture about certain people but it never mattered about the suicidal rate that was happening right in front of us and so much more."

"82nd Airborne infantry veteran here and I'm so saddened to see what's become of our military."

"5th generation Veteran, served in Afghanistan (11B) and there is no way I'd go into the military now and unless major reversal happens I can't promote this military to my sons. The army dropping down their recruitment quota only shows me, more parents and kids feel the same way."

"Retired Navy and proud to have served, thankfully not in the present era."

"I was combat in the Army (2005-2010), and people who would try to stand out or be special would be shamed for "trying to be an individual." Identity politics doesn't belong in the military on any level. To bring people together and create unit

cohesion, you focus on what you have in common, your shared risk, and shared enemy/struggle. You must assimilate and conform. If you can't or won't, then you're a liability and don't belong there. It's not about what's "fair", it's about what works."

"Wow! Such an amazing video. I was sitting back in total shock unable to move throughout. This video is completely spot on. As someone completing their 2nd contract in the Army and getting out, this was well said. I noticed the change happening from the months before COVID-19 (when I enlisted) and the months to about a year and a half following Covid. The change started small but drastically increased. (As I'm writing this I would say once Biden got in all of this gender, whatever crap you want to call it started to go really crazy. I'll just leave you with one example. We're in a foreign country, towards the beginning of the Russian/Ukraine conflict, and we get told to attend a mandatory class immediately. (I'm thinking it's war preparations or something important or even relevant.) We met fellow soldiers from around the world and it was a great experience. We traded insignia patches, hats, berets and communicated the best we could and made a lot of friends. We were far from " elite" forces. But they were very intimidated by us. We did have a chip on our shoulder. We were hard, and they knew it. There was no trouble at the march. Knowing what the same soldiers that gave us a very recognizable nod of respect would be laughing hysterically. I have absolutely no doubt there are still fine outstanding young men and women that are serving proudly. But policies like this make their jobs harder. And battles are won before they are fought. Motivating and encouraging a foe is not exactly a winning formula in the art of war."

"As a former Navy operator, I can't recommend that my son follows in my footsteps."

"My husband, son and I are all veterans that will never advise a young people to join our military."

"I'm afraid in these last three years, we have already lost a lot of fine young men who otherwise would have joined. Fine young men like the UNC fraternity brothers who rescued the American flag from terrorism. My 17 year old nephew for example is on his way to earning his private pilot certificate completing his junior year in high school.

He had aspirations to join the ROTC while in college, and then join the USAF for hopefully pilot training. He has this year ruled that out thanks to woketardism in the military and instead is just focusing on a commercial aviation career."

"I can't see why anyone would want to serve under the hostile conditions that exist in today's military. A lot of others feel the same way...and it shows. Bring back the meritocracy, testosterone, and patriotism and the military sells itself."

"A lot of young men I have talked to over the last few years who would otherwise join up some even would have made a career out of it, I have talked out of. My own Sons I talked out of as well. My family has a history of servicing in every war since the beginning. I am the last who answered the call from my family. The young men I have talked to who had questions I answered for them. Some wanted to fly and join the AF. One I was close to finished his school and promised me to take me flying with him. His family is grateful I talked him out of service."

"Young man I taught to fly and helped get into USAF flying Mud Hens (yeah I know) resigned recently. Top of his class. Test pilot school grad. Combat tours. Reason? Military brass has gone too woke. :(

"I was a combat medic for a line platoon. Deployed to Iraq. Earned my combat medical badge. We drove tanks and walked every day. Our unit was a well-oiled machine. Efficient. During our deployment, a female soldier was attached to our platoon. Long story short, we hadn't seen one woman our first three months and this female soldier had the body that basic training gives you. What people don't understand is that humans must take themselves to an unnatural mental space to handle the stress of war. Instinctual, carnal, aggressive, willing to go pull the trigger. The

complexity of dropping a dime piece on us in the middle of our deployment destabilized our platoon. My men became distracted, began competing with one another. It was not conducive to bringing everyone home safely and certainly not the place to test progressive ideas."

"My oldest son was active duty when the decision was made to integrate women into combat roles. I asked him what he thought of it. He's a linguist. He told me that in any given FOB in Afghanistan there are a bunch of Marines in their boxers saying things and doing things they might not feel comfortable saying and doing in front of a woman. Moreover, if there's an actual combat situation every guy is going to be worried about the girl, where she is, if she's safe, etc. It's a huge and unnecessary distraction and a pathetic effort on the part of the idiots running things to rub it in the faces of the men defending their country that women can do what they can do and they're not exceptional."

From a female veteran: "I served for just shy of twenty two years. Women do not need to be in a combat situation to have an adverse impact on the mission. Good people take care of their people. There are avenues to address assault and harassment. I've seen women put themselves in bad situations too. I don't think that women should be kept from serving but they do not need to be In career fields that are tip of the spear and they do not need to be in combat zones. Too many cons and not enough pros."

"Women pose an operational liability specifically because the typical age range of military service overlap with their prime childbearing years. Pregnancy, particularly in the US armed forces removes a female troop for a year. What happens when that troop is filling a critical role? There's no temp agency to call so the rest of the team picks up the slack. What if that woman is in command? How

well would a unit function if their commander was removed on the eve of a combat deployment? In technical components, the teams or duty sections tend to be small so the importance of each individual team member is magnified by scarcity. If a small team has multiple female members who all get pregnant simultaneously that can cripple a team. This happened to me. I was the #2 in a 7 person section that lost all 3 female members to pregnancy within a month. All were junior enlisted. Two were solid workers, the third was an apprentice in training. Hazards associated with the job prevented them from doing their jobs, and the apprentice's training stopped. They were essentially absent for a year between the duty restrictions while pregnant and the maternity leave afterwards. The remaining males had to pick up the slack. I was one of two NCO's. We worked 14-16 hour days for a year to pick up the slack."

"Former US Army soldier here. I had to go through Basic in Fort Jackson, South Carolina. This basic training camp was mixed, women and men. The women ruined the entire experience in so many ways. Couldn't pick up their loaded packs, couldn't do pullups which we had to do before any meal at the DFAC, constantly had to be trucked while everyone else was rucking because they 'fell out' or got injured, were always late in the morning because of their hair being out of regs or some crazy whiny shit. Every damn day it was a problem. And you know the military, everybody got smoked because some girl (usually the same 5) was late or in the wrong uniform. The women were unbelievably catty towards each other, so they wouldn't help each other out. For instance, if a guy had the wrong uniform, we all jumped on him to fix him before the drill sergeants got there. The women would leave the others out to dry but then the entire company would get punished. Pure insanity. Then, we men had to step up and cover

for them in team drills, team exercises, everything. Very, very few of them were not genuine burdens. I'm not the only one who has reported on this craziness. What made it worse, is we met other soldiers from other Basic Training Camps like Fort Sil that only did one gender at a time and all the guys said Basic training was straight awesome. They couldn't believe their ears when we told them about our experience with mixed genders. The drill sergeants found lesbian love letters, girls in each other's beds, men on 'self-deletion' watch because they thought a girl liked them. Craziness left and right."

"Marine veteran (female) here. Got injuries right out of the gate, despite being very athletic my whole life. I loved serving but our bodies aren't meant for that."

"As an old vet who went to war multiple times as infantry, i do not think women should be on the front line in any capacity. Medics? Sure. Maintenance? Go for it. Legal or admin? Absolutely. I have no faith that any woman could pick me up in my gear while she was in her gear and I'm small for a guy. I was 5'7 and 160lbs but i wore 70lbs of gear so now I'm 230lbs. As an infantryman, that's "light weigh" for us. I could carry the 6ft tall 230lbs guy who had the saw ammo for like 20ft. were looking at 300lbs plus my 230lbs. I've never seen a woman move that situation and i would never expect a woman to do it. Then, there's the psychological aspect where most men are raised to protect women, so if she gets shot, do you keep returning fire or focus on her out of concern? If you kill the treat, you're safe and have time but she may bleed out. If you stop shooting, they may get brave enough to stand up and throw a grenade.... what do you do? If you thought about this for more than 1 second, a bullet just flew past your head because you stopped shooting. That's the reality."

"I knew a guy who served in the forces. He said thanks to the DEI initiatives they were promoting women into leading roles who weren't ready for it and he ended up having to baby sit and train his new superiors. Obviously this makes no sense and he ended up leaving."

"I was in the service. Women serving with me were consistently held to lower standards almost across the board both mentally and physically, and even then they often struggled to keep up. What more need be said? Well, that the women were also the most sexually aggressive and promiscuous compared to the men even in the midst of basic training. That should also be noted. Also, there was more than one instance of false assault allegations, and in each case, the female eventually admitted to fabricating the claim for often entirely juvenile reasons."

"In the USN it was a regular experience to see woman get pregnant before a deployment so they could get sent to shore duty. we regularly went to sea "undermanned" because of this."

"I was in the USAF from 1999-2009. Many women became pregnant and could not deploy and some became pregnant intentionally so they could get out of the Air Force without finishing their enlistment."

"I was a infantry team leader who was in Iraq at a COP with just my company there so for the most part no woman except 5 times, the first was a woman MP came out for 2 weeks to search Iraqi woman during elections and she was definitely green but professional, the second was a reporter who came out for 3 days and ended up giving a staff sgt the clap, the 3rd was when we got blown up and called EOD and for some reason that air force eod had a woman LT in charge...well they got blown up on the way out to us and she started crying over the radio to the point where my LT told

her to give the comms to her male private driver so we could get the location (we showed up and she was still bawling, thank god it wasn't a ambush) the 4th was a Iraqi American woman who was supposed to be our level 4 interpreter but she saw us roll in after being attacked and she instantly quit lol, the 5th was a Iraqi interpreter my buddy met while doing a special mission outside of sector and within 4 days she had sucked off 6 of the 9 guys in the squad lol."

"I got shot in Afghan back in '11 in July and it took four other Marines to run me to the bird. It was over 100m sprint in a field and one corner still dropped me from exhaustion in 120 degree weather during a tic. I say this with the least amount of prejudice but women don't belong on the battlefield. Men are better warfighters. A better investment is filling all the spots with the most capable warfighters."

"Women in combat, bad idea. Anyone who has had basic infantry training and understands interlocking fields of fire from two-person [sic] fighting positions KNOWS that that discipline will break down if there's a man and a woman manning that position. The man will invariably do what it takes to protect the woman. It's inherent in a man's DNA. The first WESTPAC US Navy 6 month deployment in the 80s with, if memory serves, had 14 women on the carrier and 13 returned pregnant. The old fuddies in the Pentagon all looking blankly at each other, "How did that happen?" Really?"

"My oldest son was still active duty when they decided to put women in combat positions. I asked him what he thought of it. He said in an FOB you could have a bunch of Marines in their boxers saying and doing things they wouldn't feel comfortable doing or saying with a woman around. In the desert they have to shit in a box in the sand. In combat they'd all be worried about where the

woman was and if she was safe. She'd be a distraction. He said it was like the people in charge were trying to tell the war fighters that women could do anything they could do, that they weren't exceptional. Set the bar high and people reach for it. Set it low and you get what you ask for. If you want to keep your country safe train the best war fighters and give them the freedom to do their job unhindered. The military is no longer effective if it's a social experiment for the left."

"While recruitment is already way down, as these West Point cadets graduate, and bring their woke indoctrination with them to their various commands, you'll see retention rates drop drastically, even more so than seen currently. A friend I served with, an O-6 (colonel), took an early retirement, despite outstanding Officer Evaluation Reviews resulting in early promotions, due to pervasive Army wide wokeism."

"I live near a U.S. Military base and as a Vet I can state unequivocally that standards are going down, down, and even further down in a death spiral like I've never seen in my 78 years and counting. Even the main gate sentries are ridiculous and wouldn't last a week in earlier times. They are shorter, fat, visibly out of shape, and completely clueless when asked even a simple question — like "why is the Flag flying at 1/2 mast today?? The answer: you are greeted with is a blank stare and "I don't know, Sir ... " Pathetic .. disgraceful ... I don't think we could "win" against the Salvation Army these days ... let alone a real enemy."

"I'm an old school Navy Chief and retired back in 1997 after serving for 22 years. The reason I never made the next higher rank of Senior Chief is because I didn't give a damn what your rank was, if you were a screw up you were going to hear about it from me. Now it looks like the whole damn system has lost its mind. I have two grandsons on active duty now. I'm sure they do NOT like being forced to "train" on DEI crap. In reality is is treason and blatant sedition being committed in plain sight. I would not last a day in the military now. As the former top gun EP3 aircraft fleet instructor flight engineer and I did not tolerate lack of proper military bearing. There is a reason for it and ignoring military bearing weakens the ranks leadership structure immensely. In the heat of combat nobody will give a sh\_t about DEI training."

"My grandson graduated college and wanted to go into the military (we were a military family). We begged him not to do it because it is not the same military my son and husband went into and were proud to do so. He became a fireman."

"I retired from the military in 2015. I work as a DoD civilian now and I don't even recognize the military anymore. There are no standards and there isn't a mission."

"Similar situation here. I personally seen an AF commander walking around outside of a hanger picking up trash with a pointed stick while the noncoms inside sat around inside watching TV. I could see both at the same time."

"Same here! I retired in 2008 and am a DoD civilian and I work with Active Duty and honestly, I'm disgusted by what I see. I personally work with some AWESOME officers, but they are all ready to get out, because things have changed so much...and not for the better. I was talking to one of our young AF Capt's and he is one of the really good ones...and he said all of his friends are getting out because they are no longer able to make POSITIVE changes and troops are getting away with everything...no weight standards (we have an AF Col and I swear his buttons are going to fly off his uniform, he is that fat! NO RESPECT any longer...it's such a different world. I have always been and will

ALWAYS be Warfighter first! but TRUMP needs to come in and clean this shit up!"

"Retired back in 2012 (13F).....Best decision I ever made. For the 1st time in my life, I would caution my kid about joining."

"I've been in the Army since 2020 as Blackhawk mechanic. I know two women who are pregnant and are actively flying in UH-72 Lakotas; one as a pilot and the other as a flight medic. In aviation, you have to maintain flight hours if you are a flyer. These women are restricted in what they can do in a helicopter and, once their pregnancy reaches a certain stage, will no longer be allowed to fly at all. As for all the other gender confusion/ DEI stuff that's going on, I personally am not seeing it in a big way. That's not saying it's not happening, just that it's not as prevalent as folks might think. Keep in mind that our active duty makes up over 1 million people and our reserves and National Guard are right around 800,000. If you take 1000 weirdos out of that nearly 2 million people and give them a camera, it's going to look like our whole fighting force is falling apart. I promise you, if it comes time to fight, the real warriors will step up in a big way. All hope is not lost folks!"

"You're kidding me right? It's in all the "equality" doctrine they push on us. My unit has a few trannies and they're absolute mental cases. One was collecting garbage in his room for months. Can't do anything about it."

"So I'm guessing you left high school at least 4-6 years ago. The reason why you don't see it like older folks is because you were fed this stuff in High School. Maybe not so much if you went to school before that."

"There are a lot of anti-white propaganda books in the Holloman Air Force library on the front display as soon as you walk in."

"Former Marine, I don't recognize this world. But I did swear an oath, with no expiration date."

"Hey boys! I'm an airman, S&E medic for the USAF. I love the guys and gals in my unit, most of which are competent and airman that I can rely on to do their job to an exceptional degree. The sentiment that DEI is absolutely fucking retarded and serves only to kneecap our mission capabilities is omnipresent among the enlisted side. Even some on the commissioned side will speak their mind about it behind closed doors."

"My son would have been the 11th generation in Service from my family... he has paused his Commissioning. It was his dream for the last 10 years."

"I come from several generations of service members going back to the war of 1812, and this will be the first generation that won't have someone serving. I served during Desert Storm, but I won't try to encourage my kids to serve under this administration. Perhaps my grandkids will have a better chance, but not if we don't stop supporting this warped ideology. I still support the Veterans and will to the day I die."

"I retired from the military in 2012. I was able to see this starting to creep in. For the most part, most of the non-comms still had a pretty solid idea of why they were there. The worst, that I saw, were the mid to upper level commissioned officers. It's like they went to War College and received a lobotomy. Makes me sad to see....I'm glad I'm not beating my head against that wall now."

"I've seen it. This is really been pushed hard in the past 2 years. No need to tell you why or who is doing this...none of this existed before and even younger troops are upset by the agenda forced on them."

"I retired in Nov 22 after 35 years, refused to sit in and refused to track as the G3 the 4 mandatory Transgender Training events everyone was supposed to take. I and several others could see the change and decided it was time to leave."

"Let this not get you down because the primary warfighters, infantry and special forces are still the best of the best. The Rangers, SEALs and AF Special Warfare have not lowered their standards and don't let anyone into their units that they don't trust with life. I'm a in a regular USAF unit and the DEI influences are a mere light annoyance on the ground level. The biggest problem is a culture of people joining for the wrong reasons and not taking the job seriously. It's led to a degradation in work quality respect between teammates."

"I come from a family legacy of military service. My great uncle Jumbo rode with Pershing chasing Pancho Villa, my grandfather was a paratrooper in the Army in WWII, my Dad is a Marine who served ready at the Bay of Pigs, my Uncle is a Marine who went through the Tet Offensive in Viet Nam, I joined the Marines at age 17 with the Iran Hostage Crisis as my motivation along with the family history. My son wanted to serve and due to what you are covering today I talked him out of."

"The wokeness is why I left the military. I was lucky enough to have more than 20 years in."

"I was an EOD and scout sniper Corpsman. I fought on the front lines of combat in two campaigns. The military today is woke garbage. The fighting spirit has been replaced for political correctness."

"Our son abruptly retired as an officer last year after 20 years of service. He had enjoyed being in the service and hoped to stay longer. He had never seen so much political pressure put on (relative to DEI) and couldn't stand it any longer. He went to work for the state government where he lives and it's the SAME situation. So much more work could get done if the best qualified gets the job without racism or sexism being the tipping scale."

"In the 1970s, the USMC had human relations classes, that we were required to attend annually. They did more harm than good. Marines would come from training feeling divided, when the Corps depended on unit cohesiveness. Even now I worked with young Marines, and sadly the Corps not what it used to be, all in the need to implement and force DEI upon them. DEI does not win wars, competent, trained warfighters do."

"When I was commissioned into the Air Force in 1983, the mission statement was simple, "Fly, fight and win." Promotions were merit based. Then came McPeak who left the Air Force unrecognizable. When I retired in 2009 after several leadership changes, the mission statement was "Fly, fight and win in the air, space and cyberspace." Now, you have senior officers more interested in using the correct pronouns than being combat ready. I really hope the next administrations will revoke the commissions of those officers that are not combat ready and place more emphasis on using the correct pronouns."

"I have responded to my 6'4", 245 lb, Honor Roll student and defensive end to NOT consider the military until they pull their collective heads out of their 4th point of contact! The military I served in WAS NOT a social petri dish to conduct social experimentation! Signed by a retired 1SG."

"As a navy Vietnam vet I used to encourage young people to go into the military. Not anymore. Not under this screwball administration."

"My Air Force vet family has taken down all pins/badges/old Air Force memorabilia. They're embarrassed to be associated with it anymore."

"I have a relative who WAS in the Navy until about 3 years ago. He was a fairly high level (I forget, but I know his military retirement is \$90,000/year) with 30+ years of very important logistics jobs he solely accomplished after being a pilot for 20 years. Sharp, assertive in his roles and extremely resourceful. About 4 years prior he told me about how he had to take a 'Critical Race' course that included him having (forced) to write a paper on how he was the problem and what he should do about it. He hated it, but knew not to complain. Simultaneously he was 'passed over' three times for re-commissioning. Seeing minorities and woman with massively less experience and skills get promoted past him. He reluctantly resigned his commission."

"I served two years – one in the jungles of Vietnam - so I am familiar with what it was like then. My battalion has annual reunions and we have active members, usually six, that attend. The battalion commander brings five of the best soldiers who earned the privilege to come. A couple of years ago about half a dozen of us vets and four of the enlisted men sat around drinking beers and BSing. The subject of re-enlisting came up and all four said they were not going to re-enlist because of priority placed on sensitivity classes, using the correct pronouns, etc. These were all soldiers who had at least six years of training and experience and considered the elite to get to come to our reunion and are now no longer in the service because of "Woke" policies."

"We are a military family, with some still serving. Great friends also have kids in. Military academy alums. Thought they'd all be lifers. They're all leaving."

"Dear Secretary Wormuth:

I watched your recent Congressional testimony with shock and dismay. It is clear to me that you are in absolute denial regarding the Army's ongoing recruiting crisis, and I am writing now in hopes of penetrating the fog of delusion that apparently surrounds you and the Chief of Staff.

I come from a family with a long tradition of proud Army service, dating back to the Spanish-American War. I myself am a retired Army officer, having served in Desert Storm, OIF and OEF. I think it is important that you understand why this is.

Below are the reasons why generational Army families now tell their children to never enlist:

- 2. Poor equipment and training readiness ratings means we are building yet another Task Force Smith.

"My wife's family is retired Air Force and have taken all their medals off the walls at home because of what that institution has become."

"My family's military service stretches back as far as we keep records, to pre-revolutionary times. Every generation, at least one male has served in some capacity. That unbroken line of service ends with my sons. I am actively steering them away from it now."

"I too come from a long line of men and their families who have served in the military (noting that the families also serve in their own patriotic way where the sacrifices can be enormous). And zero percent of any of us would recommend ANYONE we care about ever go to any military college or sign up to serve in any of the branches of the armed forces."

"This RETIRED SFC agrees. The army is a total shitshow at the moment. I do encourage young men with military potential to join the Marines. They haven't slipped off the deep end into wokeness as much and still train Hard."

great grandfather in the 1890's, and his father before him 1860's. They will not be getting my son for all the reasons you have stated above plus one more. This trend of the political class to look for conflicts abroad and involve the US Military in conflicts that are regional in nature and not necessarily a threat to America for political purposes, money and possibly to distract from failures at home. No more."

"Standing in agreement COL (R) TC 33 yrs service Enlisted- Officer Retired 2022"

"Amen!!! I am an Army Vet, proud descendant of those who served... and encouraged my boys to serve, which they did. Now if any grandchild/young person I know would want to join, I would STRONGLY discourage them. I used to say, I would go back in if they would let me...NO WAY now."

"I recently had a nephew leave the Army due in part to the DEI nonsense. He is not white."

"LTC(R) here, fully concur. The Army's job is to close with and destroy the enemy. That has been discarded in favor of the woke agenda. It stated with the 2008 election and is the main reason I declined promotion to COL and retired instead."

"I served 20 + years on active duty. My time in service was rewarding for the most part and I am glad I served but I now tell my grandchildren not to join and my reasons should be obvious even to the most casual observer."

"Retired in 03 and both my daughter and son joined the military, AF and Navy. I encouraged them to get an education but joining the military was their choice and I supported that as well. Fast forward to my tour in Europe (2019-2021) and the issues compounded further with extremism standown, early stages of Get Real, Get Better (response to readiness issues that caused the collisions and loss of 17 guys), leaders like Captain Crozier, Col Scheller, and Col Lohmeier calling out obvious neo-Marxist and radical ideologies and being fired for it. "Back when I was in, ALL military personnel were brothers and sisters. Race didn't matter, if you liked or disliked someone didn't matter, you were all family, and had to trust each other with your lives."

"Was in from 2013-2017, was a police officer after I got out and went back active after Russia invaded Ukraine because we're on deck for war. The difference now from when I first came in 11 years ago is terrifying... it's a complete 180 degree turn. I do believe we're still a lethal force. Just not the same culture. This culture sucks. "We cannot get the best of young our patriots to sign up when we have a weak freckles leadership, DEI and Woke lax standards. My nephew is a cadet at West Point and my other nephew is in the Air Force."

"I know someone in the military who is getting out after 10 years because of woke culture."

"I retired from the Navy and I was a Navy recruiter for three years and I refuse to recommend the present day military as a career choice. I work in a DOD building and the "wokeness" is suffocating. The officers are the "wokest". The officers I worked with had flown hundreds of combat missions in Vietnam and they would knock you're head off of your shoulders rather than sit there and wonder about how you were feeling. This is the first time in my life, and I'm 55 years old, that I wouldn't recommend a young man or woman join the military. Why would they? It's not about defending the country anymore, it's not a military, it's a testing and proving ground where you might even get to fight a war and die for a cause that is completely pointless. "I joined the military in 1976 and served until 1985. I then worked with the Department of Defense as a contractor until 2023. Most of these contracting jobs had direct contact with service members, so I got to witness firsthand the slow decline of our military, and its culture. Sad...very sad."

"I'm a girl and the 90s commercial made me want to join the army......the girly commercials of today did absolutely nothing but make me cringe."

"Served 20 years from 1983-2003. Have advised my grandson to avoid the military at all costs. The service is broken and needs a complete leadership overhaul to recover."

"Every single man in my family served in America's army since the French and Indian War...I served in Iraq as Airborne Infantry in the 82d Airborne and got out after just one enlistment. I actively discourage family and any young people who ask me if they should join. I'm symbolically in touch with the end of an era for what was the military tradition of the United States. It's over."

"I got out of recruiting and the Army all together about two years ago. I had never met a real narcissist until I met my transgender station commander... I got some stories but I had to sign an NDA but I promise y'all South Park couldn't write this script."

"20 year veteran who joined in October 2001. My kids are not allowed to enlist. They'll be the first generation of my family in over a century not to serve."

"I am a 26 year veteran of the Navy, 6 years of which was as a recruiter. I can't imagine telling a 17 year old kid today that if he joined there was a good chance he would have to bunk with an openly gay or transgender sailor. Wokeness has destroyed the services."

"30 years in the Army, Purple Heart, 3 combat deployments, and an amputee. I retired immediately to escape the political climate in 2020 pre Covid. Best decision ever!"

## **USNA Race-based Admissions Trial**

"As an ex submarine officer, I wanted the best qualified people on the crew. If one person failed to do a critical job properly, we could have all died together. Race has no place in any selection process."

"My sons are both Marines. One is an Annapolis alumnus and the other was accepted but decided not to go. My son doesn't wear his ring at all ever. I'm pretty sure if the worst should happen, Harris is elected, both will resign their commissions and get out."

"I know a young man who graduated West Point. He wanted to make the military a career. He has since resigned his commission for this very reason. He is white and says the military has become way too WOKE." "I don't know current policy as I retired from the AF in 1998, but while I was on active duty we were required to state at the end of every fitness report that "so & so supports the affirmative action program." I never objected to this at first because I had no idea what it meant. By the time I made E-7 I learned about an AF regulation that covers affirmative action. It was short, only a few pages, but it laid down the rules for this program. It required that the test promotion scores for white males be lowered until they were below the level of cutoff that would capture enough "promotees" within the targeted race or sex. Discrimination 101."

"I hope they are successful in their efforts. I'm a retired Naval Officer. Received my commission through NROTC. Son of a Naval officer which made me eligible for a presidential appointment in the early 70s. At the time I think there were 100 each year. I was 104th on the list of candidates even though I was at the top of the class academically, basketball team, student government, etc. Mother is Japanese, so part of an even smaller minority. I see these efforts over the years as favoring specific groups and not in the best interests of the service. Admissions should be solely on merit and aptitude."

"My grandson graduated this year from USMA West Point. He said that some of the instructors were absolutely woke and probably thought that not mis-gendering the enemy was more important than war fighting skills."

"Prediction: It will lead to under qualified people in the wrong places and a weaker organization... like it has 100% of the time it is tried anywhere else."

"If you want to have the academies reflective of population composition of our country the answer is to have students prepare earlier in their education/life. To lower the standard just to get

"Regardless of skin color or ethnicity, future military officers need to have sufficient intelligence, physical performance, character and integrity to do the job. We call it "merit" for short. The people of the United States deserve to be defended by the best. Everyone has an equal opportunity to strive to be the best, not a guarantee to get a place on the basis of DEI."

"Where is merit? Where is the idea of passing tests and personal interviews? Where is competition to earn a place in the Academy or any other place you want to be? This ain't my Navy! I have written that phrase too many times in the near past or recently with the many things I see that have left our Spit and Polished way of life. While being a Midshipman myself many moons ago, there was competition but also friendship between all of us and no mention of any kind of race preference was ever talked about or even thought of! By the way, there were no women Midshipmen in the middle fifties. I have seen all measures of people, women and men now in the ranks of the Naval Academy Midshipmen and never thought of any kind of DEI at all! Beat Army!"

"How about we seek the best and brightest without regard for bathrooms, preferences or heritage."

"Once we pick the most qualified candidates not based on color, sex or religion, then we can begin to call ourselves a racist free country."

"The sad part is that a large portion of the "DEI plebes" will wash out over the four years, since they're not adequately prepared in some way or another. Saw this situation often, and the feeling that "other qualified applicants were cheated out

of a spot/chance" is common. The ones who did make it through, even after five years, were good to go and many have done well in their military careers. In the long run however, the DEI scheme just doesn't work in a vital organization such as the military."

"If DEI is so great, why are people unhappy when they are called a DEI hire? Shouldn't they feel honored?"

"It should be a strictly merit based selection process. People can more likely die when not choosing the best candidates."

"My friend wants to know if the Chinese have racebased initiatives for their military leaders."

"When you fight Racism with Racism the end result is Racism."

"I remember when women were first admitted. Some had to be twice as good to get equal recognition. Some got twice the recognition for half the effort. Some got ahead by giving it. I definitely remember body fat on women being reclassified as "loose muscle" in order to avoid kicking them out for being, uh, basically, fat. The men didn't get that consideration."

"I was a PRT PO, I had women who couldn't do one pull up, enough sit-ups or push ups, and forget the run. They somehow passed while men were forced to do remedial PT."

"Choosing because of race or gender over skill, intelligence, competency = lower standards = downfall of academies. It's also reverse racism."

"The attorneys argue that "unlike civilian universities, USNA prepares students for war." As a veteran, I would prefer that the officer leading me into battle got into the service academy because he was smarter than the other applicants. Not

because he was black, Latino or some other preferred group. DEI has no place in the military."

"USNA's new cadets: 4 Native Americans, 70 African Americans, 132 Asian Americans, 178 Hispanic Americans and 642 Whites." What, Whites are not Americans? Or you tell me you cannot say White American?"

"When I was in USN flight school in the midseventies, minority students received 5 points extra on exams. As a result, many unqualified minority students earned their "wings." In the fleet, some NFOs refused to fly with some because of the risk. Many of these NFOs were then separated from service when it was reflected on their performance evals. It was a very dangerous practice to give an extra 5 exam points on the basis of race."

"I am a combat veteran, also a woman. When I went into the Army then accepted to flight school, there was none of this crazy DEI "race" stuff. And thank God, because I would have never felt I truly earned it. And while in flight school I had the same requirements as the men to include physical. Yet, the Army was very diversified. A lot of that was thanks to Reagan. Take the best. In the academies you are also preparing for war. A bullet isn't discriminating so to speak."

"Ask any enlisted Navy or Marine personnel and they will quickly tell you it's easy to identify officers who were given preferential treatment in their admission to the Academy."

"Most candidates are unaffected by the consideration of race," lawyers for the Naval Academy wrote in court filings. That's a lie. Every candidate that is admitted and every candidate that isn't admitted are affected by race in the selection process. Those that were admitted all know that someone was admitted because of race that wasn't qualified and someone wasn't admitted because of race whom was qualified."

"I went to the Air Force Academy back in the early '90's. I'm a white female. The first year that I applied, I was nominated but not appointed. I went to prep school for a year and got in the next year. I only recall one black guy in my basic training flight. I will never forget him. He was a disaster at everything. I'm far from perfect, but this dude couldn't get anything right. Not a dang thing. And it brought all of us down as we tried to help him memorize his "knowledge" or even make his bed correctly. I have not a doubt in the world as to why he was there. And he left after basic training."

"In 1963, I entered the Naval Academy as 1 of 4 non-white guys in the Class of '67. I, an Asian, was proud that I earned my appointment competitively and would not have wanted otherwise."

"Admission should be on merit and nothing else! Race based or DEI is a mistake that will get people killed in combat operations."

"Navy has used racial/gender preferential treatment in officer promotion boards for DECADES. The section board precepts mandate "X" number of females, blacks, Hispanics and Asians be selected for the rank being considered. It means other, more qualified applicants, will not always be chosen so they can diversify the Fleet ranks. Yet, they don't call this racial discrimination? Go figure."

"When my son applied to the Naval Academy early 90's he was told "we need Hispanics from the Barrio...". My son is blonde."

"Without respect to a person's race, I want the best, most competent, and intelligent people leading our armed forces. That is national security."

"I was glad to see that 2nd to last paragraph. This BS has been going on for decades. While I was an ROTC instructor from 92-95, I was in charge of my unit's Express Scholarship program, which provided students of color a full ride ticket plus a monthly stipend. All they had to do was pass the physical, pass the AFOQT qualification test and maintain a 2.0 GPA...yes, a 2.0 GPA. White students need not apply. The number of very bright engineering, math, computer science and nurses wanting to join the Air Force that weren't eligible for the scholarship was depressing. After several years and coming to the realization that not many of the applicants could pass the test, they gave them extra tries to pass, which no one else received. When that didn't work, they just dumbed down the test. Pretty scary stuff!"

"This is one of the most dangerous, idiotic, woke decisions ever. To think you are going to have 18-20 year old men and women cramped together for 6 months at a time and not have problems. I remember when they put women on surface ships, jealousies, affairs and pregnancies were the results. The performance went downhill. There were transfers of females, court marshals, etc. Now they will be cramped in a cylinder under the ocean. This is a safety issue, you cannot devoid young men and women from being young men and women. Big problems coming on a billion dollar nuclear submarine."

"WOW a DEI submarine now I really feel safe!"

"Gee, I'm sure that's really important, glad that they didn't spend those monies on useless stuff like stealth and weapons...smh"

"They are not really separating them, they are making it more convenient to cohabitate and making it so weak people can operate the machinery and levers. And yes, I just retired last month after 36 years in the military. The plug has been pulled and the military is in the final stages of swirling down the drain."

"This, I would think shouldn't be a problem with the sheer amount of surveillance in the subs today. It's really the gay and trans people that present a real problem with morale. People I know there say that."

"As an Iraq war vet who served in a co-ed unit, I can say that going to war with women is one of the worst things you can do. It is a very bad idea. It creates unnecessary problems for commanders and weakens the units overall strength and war fighting capacity. That is just the fact."

"If you did not decide to go woke you would not have had to retrofit subs and designate washrooms thus saving millions of dollars. Now you are going to have to do that on all new build of subs, ships, etc. Go woke, go broke."

"My son just retired he said after 20 years you can't even recognize the Military anymore it's changed so much with this nonsense."

"My husband said the same thing he was so happy to get out. After everything he has learned being in and now being out of the military and he is a 4 generation military family, says he would never ever recommend anyone to go to the military unless they want to be a lawyer or a doctor otherwise stay far away."

"I still know people who are active duty now and I was active duty for 12 years. None of it will be new it will just be new on a new submarine. I've known junior lady petty officers who made a bunch of money from their shipmates on liberty. They talked it up and got totally free liberty and made \$\$ to boot. There was a female PO1 whose sister let slip she had an abortion immediately after cruise. It is not hearsay and there is a lot more. Human nature

is all you have to understand along with having a very small portion of common sense."

"I served 20 years in the Navy. When my son asked about serving, I had to encourage him not to. Very sad."

"I am a US Navy submariner vet. Submarine culture is very different. This project is going to have a lot of problems. You're in your own world on a sub, the stress you're under is immense and in the event of an emergency there is no room for failure. Pregnancy will affect the boat hard because replacing a crew member short notice is close to impossible."

"I served on a frigate when we first brought females on board. All this issues Mat claimed would happen, did happen. We gained nothing except lots of sexual tension and a general reduction in morale. Well, except for the people who were now getting laid underway."

"Yep, was on an FFG back in 90-91, went ashore due to an injury and working with female sailors was very different, lots of drama, lots of BS. Females in my rate (Boatswain's Mate) couldn't do the same work and it was disgusting to see them in a working party refuse to carry their load because Navy regs only require them to carry 30 pounds when the cans of paint we hand to move were 50 pounds. Saw female sailors tell others to get pregnant to get out of deployment and the one ship attached to our base with women, was always breaking down and at the time some 50 female sailors and over 100 males were busted for prostitution or soliciting. After Tailhook and the endless sexual harassment stand-down trainings, where a feminazi in shoulder pads lectured us on why men bad, and seeing the writing on the wall, I decided not to re-enlist. There were other reasons, but this was in the mix. And I saw where it was headed back in 93!"

"I was a soldier in the Army back when women were not allowed to be combat arms units. But due to some fluke reason, while we were in Iraq, a female cook was assigned to our artillery unit. Immediately, problems arose. Special accommodations had to be made just for her. Guys were constantly hitting on her. Some guys would go out of their way to "help her out" with work, to curry favor with her. It's human nature crap like that which breaks down unit cohesion and is simply avoided by removing women from the equation. There was zero benefit to her being there but plenty of cons."

"As a Navy submarine vet, this is a terrible idea. It used to be a difficult task of getting your submarine warfare pin (dolphins). There are a number of tasks on board a submarine during any kind of casualty, whether it be flooding, fire, reactor emergency, or any kind of other emergency. Will women be able to perform basic tasks in emergencies, like pulling unconscious grown men out of compartments that are filling up with smoke, or fire, among many other tasks. Operating valves when under tension make it extremely difficult for them to shut or open. Do we expect a 140 pound female to carry or even drag a 240 pound male out of a compartment when necessary? There's a reason why women weren't allowed on submarines since their inception, and it wasn't because the Navy are discriminating, or it wasn't because they were going to come back pregnant either."

"As a Navy Submariner. I want all you nonsubmariners to know something! Everything you're thinking might happen...has and probably will again."

"It's going to be a massive problem. On surface ships, female sailors get pregnant at alarmingly high rates. Every now and then the press wants to attribute this to "assault," but the reality is most of

these liaisons are consensual. When these female sailors get pregnant, they're taken back to shore, which obviously disrupts the operation of the boat. Everything is worse on a sub. All of the crew (~100) is necessary for operating the boat, which stays submerged much of the time. So when a female sailor gets pregnant in this new regime, the sub must break off its mission, surface, rendezvous with transportation to get the pregnant female off, find some way to replace her in a small crew and then get back to its mission. This is ignoring lack of strength for performing damage control, mood swings on a monthly cycle, etc. It's a disaster waiting to happen."

"My word! Half those girls will wind up pregnant and that's a fact. During Desert Storm they had a hospital ship that had so many pregnancies they called the ship 'The Love Boat'."

"The ship you are referring to was the USS ACADIA" (AD-42). It was aa destroyer tender with 30% of the crew female. (I know because I was there.) I had three junior females and one male working for me in my division. None of my girls got pregnant during that cruise, but some 56 females in all did, although the command claimed that 42 were married and became impregnated either before deployment or during overseas portcalls when their husbands visited and got a hotel room ashore. I think the Navy made a major mistake in 1978 when the WAVES were disestablished and women were incorporated into the regular Navy to be assigned to sea duty. No one will ever convince me that women belong aboard ships or submarines. If military readiness and warfighting are your aims, then leave the ships to the men..... I was telling you what the command 'claimed.' Yes, I agree that even 14 is a high number. There were 330 women assigned to ACADIA out of a crew of nearly 1200. Yes, there were female berthing (NOT 'birthing') compartments aboard ship. The problem for illicit

couples 'hooking up' was where to find an isolated space where they could consummate their relationship. The ship was more akin to a college campus where the sexual tension was always flying high. Nuts!!!"

"USN vet here. Women have to be carried which degrades the overall performance of the ship. They can't cope with the long periods at sea and break down much faster than the males. I remember the long line every morning leading to medical for morning sick call, all female. There are other issues including discipline which is a nightmare. Women don't respond to male authority the same as other males will. Then there is the pregnancy issue. Going to sea for months at a time sucks. The best way to avoid a deployment is to get pregnant. The Navy will give them a nice easy job on base that used to be filled by male sailors on their much deserved shore duty rotation. Shore duty continues after pregnancy because the mother needs to be with the infant. You will hear the truth from vets, usually after they have been discharged, about the performance of women in all the branches."

"50% of the females will turn up pregnant before deployment, so they don't have to deploy. Since pregnancy is a "temporary" medical condition, their position will not be back-filled, and the ship will deploy short handed. As an ex-Naval Officer, I saw this trend happen again and again with the non-combatant ships (ie. Tenders) when I served. And, I will end with this -- I would have resigned my commission before serving on that boat."

"I met my current wife aboard the USS Holland (AS-32). She was part of the very first tranche of female sailors assigned to shipboard duty. Of the 200 females initially detailed to the Holland, only 2 completed their full tours - my wife being one of them. The other was a lesbian. As you say, when it

got difficult - they got pregnant (even many of the lesbians)."

"I spent six years active duty in the USN, mostly aboard a guided missile destroyer. Three overseas deployments. I am utterly disgusted with this new progressive poison being pushed by "leadership". It has nothing to do with war fighting lethality. Worst of all, on a personal level, instead of looking forward to my sons carrying on a long family tradition of military service, I now discourage them from serving at all."

"Women have been on submarines for a long time. This one was just actually designed with that in mind instead of having converted male quarters and lots of inconveniences as a result. But what a nightmare to call it a win for "inclusivity." That sounds more like a win for politics and a loss for the Navy."

"Retired from the active duty Navy in 2003 when it was a lot less woke. In all my years at sea I only served on one ship with females as crew and it was the only tour that made me want to quit. Gutted it out and moved onto better things but females on ships are NOT physically capable of doing what needs to be done. Yes there are exceptions but the rule is no. In the 80s the Navy gave it a go with an all female crewed frigate. I believe it was declared a failure after just a week."

"My husband was in the Navy for 20 years. He said there were Coed supply ships. 20% of the sailors on these ships were women. He said many of the women came back pregnant. I can only imagine what will happen when being out at sea on a Coed submarine for 6 months."

"I will say this, I was enlisted on a Destroyer. During one of our refueling, the chief in charge decided to have all Female sailors on the refueling line. I was one of those female sailors on the line. It could not have been more of a crap show. It's funny, looking back on not now, but in the moment you are working the hardest You have ever worked. There were tiny little girls being lifted off the deck. Mind you, If you have never been on a ship during refueling, We were not sitting dead in the water, we were traveling Alongside the bigger ship with the fuel. There's water spray, the deck is wet, Eventually, some male sailors, even the chief had to step in and help because we were not getting the line in place. It's funny now, and I am proud to say I did six years in the Navy. I got to see so much of the world I would have not seen otherwise. Not to mention the camaraderie. I am a lot tougher because of the Navy. I met my husband on the ship. But I cannot imagine being under the ocean, hot racking or not surfacing for weeks. One of my greatest memories of being on a destroyer was going out in the middle of in the ocean and not seeing land or another ship, The sea breeze on my face. You don't have that in submarine. My rant is over, no hate to the men who do this necessary job underwater. But I would not raise my hand as a woman to be the first."

"Thank God I got out when I did! As a former submarine-sailor I can testify to the difficulties that people experience on a sub. These claustrophobic steel cans can break the seemingly-toughest of men; both mentally and sometimes physically. One of the first things that I can think of is proper hygiene. Again it's hard enough for men to stay clean on a sub. Women have even more extreme cleanliness needs."

"As a former US Navy Submariner, I absolutely concur with Matt's conclusions regarding this policy. Unfortunately, you won't find any currently serving members voicing their true opinions. The khaki lifers who've drunk the woke Kool-aid, will claim the force is the "best evarr" now. We used to be unique. Now days, you best watch your back. A

My youngest recently wanted to serve and was met by all with a hard "no, do not do it." This country is in a world of a mess and anyone who is not a DEI hire working in the government knows exactly why."

"I am a retired Naval Commander, and agree totally with this, I would never recommend family members to serve. I am active in many military functions and listen to many speeches of leading Admirals and Captains. It takes usually less than a few words before they start expressing their DEI accomplishments. It's astonishing, how naive. I can't say DEI is a Chinese plot to destroy our military, but if it wasn't their doing, they at least appreciate the culprit."

"When my son enlisted in the Navy, he envisioned being a "lifer". But, after 15 years of service, he had enough. Even after taking the Petty Officer First Class exam several times--and getting excellent grades, he was told that there was a long list of people in front of him. Many of those people, it turned out, were DEI enlistees. The military has long used seniority over quality for advancement. Now, they are adding DEI to the mix. It's no reason veterans have a negative view of the service. Our military needs to use merit over seniority and DEI so that we will truly have the best and the brightest defending our country. We don't need a military that "looks like us" unless they are the best at killing people and breaking things."

"I come from a military family. My father was Army for 31 years, I was Army for 14 years, and two of my sons are currently Navy. My sons are tired of the crap and talk about getting out. My wife's family a lot of military too. Anyhow I don't promote military service as much as I did in the past. And if we get involved in armed conflict, I pray we don't lose a lot of our young men and women because of all this DEI and woke crap."

"Next we'll be spending millions on camouflage lipstick, .... but really I'm a 11B Vietnam vet, and crawling thru the jungles I didn't care what color, race, language spoken, or anything else as long as that person I could trust with my life. "The woke & DEI pervasive military is gutting our military. "As someone who has spent the last 41 years in the military (27 years active duty, the rest as a DoD civilian), civilians like myself are retiring in droves because of the shift in DoD. Immediately after Biden took office, we were forced to go through extremist training because the current administration was convinced the ranks were full of right wing extremists. The administration directed a study be performed and then buried the results when the study showed that there were less extremists in the military than the general population. The Army I served in was nearly 50 percent minority, with black Soldiers accounting for

"West Point, class of 1968 here. Bingo! Right on target. And the Academies are no better."

"My dad was a US Army veteran, I'm a US Army veteran, my son is a Marine Corps veteran. I can't see a scenario where I'll have a grandchild that is a veteran. That goes for all the veterans I know. It's a sad state of affairs."

"My son was so disappointed in his basic training experience 10 years ago because they had reduced the physical and phycology testing rigor to accommodate more female recruits. I expect with DEI that there is even more decline in that rigor only to be replaced by woke sensitivity training."

"We live in a small Navy town in San Diego. There are 3 bases within our city limits. We have neighbors who have retired because the Navy no longer operates on merit or excellence, but on gender, sexual orientation, and skin color. Our retiring friends are frustrated by their commands who place more value on having a woman and/or a person of color in command rather than the best person for the job."

"Those of us who have actually had their butts in a combat situation know damn well why having a DEI person next to us increases the likelihood of getting killed. no thanks."

"I know a guy that was enlisted. He got his college degree at about the 10 year point. He applied for a commission. He was denied. A black female in his chain of command that only had a GED and joined on a waiver, applied too. She was approved and commissioned. You can guess his race and why he exited the service. When the cards are that stacked against you, why even try."

"I witnessed first-hand the demise of the military's meritocracy. My experience aligns with Mr. West's. I've read the Air Force memorandum Mr. West references. Though one of my sons is a Marine, I am one of dozens of former military in my circle of friends who all advised our children to seek career options other than the military. Colonel, USAF (Ret)"

"Three generations of my family have served in the military; 3 of us are retirees. No one is encouraging any of the next generation to join."

"The Left is the most racist group of people on the planet. When they look at a group of military members their brain automatically starts calculating the racial breakup of that group and then complain when there aren't the proper percentages. I served 24 years and never saw racial issues. The best thing about back then was that if you saw someone in leadership, you knew they had earned it regardless of sex/color/creed. "Having served 31 years in the Army and Army Reserve, I was always impressed with how successful the Army had been in integrating black and white soldiers. The only important color in the Army back then was green camouflage. Everyone wore it. It was a system and culture that did not need fixing. "Especially in the officer and very senior enlisted ranks, you have to look at your odds of making those higher ranks (O-5 and above, E9). If you are a white male, you will be at a disadvantage and its well known. Because its well known, a lot of good officers and NCOs are gone after their first tour which is sad."

"The author is spot on. I can only speak for myself but all I dreamed about as a young boy was to attend West Point and serve in the Army. I did so proudly for 30 years and one of my sons followed me to West Point and between us we served multiple tours in Iraq, Kosovo, and Afghanistan. Sadly at this point I cannot recommend military service to my grandchildren. It has been disheartening to see the military's focus shift from warfighting to becoming a test lab for the country's social experiments. I have lost faith in both our political leadership and general officer corps and I know many of my fellow veterans share those sentiments."

"I'm a retired Air Force officer and I have indeed advised people not to join for the very reasons described above."

"Also retired, I have help stop four young men and a women from going into the military. They are all now successful in other endeavors. Sad."

"I retired after 27 years in the navy. I have three sons under the age of 21. THIS is why I haven't pushed it and don't care if any of them ever serve." "24 year veteran of the US Naval Submarine force who has deployed over 20 times, Honor, Courage and Commitment are the core values, not DEI. DEI will destroy the military and lead to increased casualties in battle."

"Every male in my family up to the current generation has served proudly in the armed forces. No more. There are consequences to poor leadership, losing wars, and calling all straight white males deplorable white supremacists."

"As a former Marine, I like many of the Marines I served with, would discourage my family members from joining any branch of the military. Part of it is the wholesale incompetence of the national command authority, with the military fighting wars under politically correct ROEs, and politicians losing the peace. However, the environment they are likely to encounter in the military today puts their lives at greater risk. 20 years ago the preferences being given to select demographics were annoying. Now they are potentially catastrophic. Selecting leaders to fulfill a DEI mandate will lead to more bad strategies and tactics, which will get people killed."

"I'm a Veteran and there is no way I would recommend that my grandsons serve in the military. DEI policies and effectual leadership would get them killed."

Implementing DEI policies negates the very raison d'être of the military, i.e., putting the mission first. We do that at our peril."

"I'm a 3rd generation Marine. I would not want either of my sons to join the military under the current general officers who are worried about "white rage", DEI and trans-recruitment. The focus of an effective military organization is being capable of making your enemies die for their country, not hookie leftie unicorn wimpy nonsense."

"40 yrs in the AF - active duty + civilian. I feel like I wasted my life. Would never recommend or allow anybody I care about to get near the military now. Left 7 yr ago when it was all 'diversity'; can't imagine how much worse woke is."

"I retired from the U.S. Navy after serving 37 years. Included were 3 combat tours, the first of which was the last war that the United States actually won (Desert Storm), the last being our most recent loss (Afghanistan). I have an 18 year old son set to graduate from high school at the end of this academic year and already committed to play a sport at college next year. Do you think I'm talking to him about joining the service? Any service? Absolutely not! If he expressed an interest in joining, I would attempt to dissuade him. We have abused the privilege presented by our all volunteer force. Time to reinstitute conscription (to include women) and force our feckless leaders to persuade the American people where our vital strategic interests lie and why they're worth American blood and treasure."

"This has been going on for quite a while - probably in higher gear in the past decade as the whole DEI movement gained momentum. In the late 80's, I was at a training rotation in the Army (had the bad luck of reporting in early so I was assigned to be platoon leader.) The Army had just started experimenting with integrating females in combat oriented training and I had 3 in my platoon. I was called in a meeting with the Battalion Commander and his CSM - they explained that I'd have 3 females, what an honor it was, how important it was, etc. Then, to make sure I understood the situation, the BC said loudly "Russell, if they fail, you fail!" Nothing against females serving - maybe the vetting process is better these days for combat oriented training - these three were not ready or able. I'm convinced the experience set back future officers, who might otherwise have been more accepting of expanding service opportunities for females, as they went about their careers. Tough, fair standards motivate people. This practice was a demotivator. If DEI is emphasized over standards, it will too."

"When I enlisted in 1975 the Army was the most racially diverse organization in the country. Great pride was taken in that fact and rightly so. My base commander was African American as were a healthy and representative amount of the NCO and Officer corps. I made my first black friends which greatly broadened my perspective. So what happened? Why fix what was not broken with these so-called DEI initiatives? I will say that what was most difficult for many of us, to be real, was when the first female troops joined us in our advanced training. Under those conditions of hardship and stress, to have a beautiful blond right next to you was very distracting. I don't know how you manage the gender issue but it was a complication that made focusing on the mission difficult."

"My wife and I both retired as Army colonels. I spent 30 years on active duty, and my wife spent 26. Then we both continued to work for the Army as federal senior civilians for another twelve years. We retired completely in 2018. All this DEI toxicity is just a continuation of the equal opportunity poison that started with Jimmy Carter and Clifford Alexander the SECARMY at the time. more than most. DEI is absolutely foolish and destructive. Our leaders are destroying us with it. And for NO benefit even, it's just because they're too weak and wimpy to stand for anything. They'll say whatever will keep them in good graces with the wokenuts in power."

"I can only imagine the military leadership in China, North Korea, Iran and Russia unbelief that any military person would swallow the DEI line and fervently praying that we continue that insanity. We are losing the next war before it even begins."

"As an OEF vet- and I hate to say this- we're going to have this nonsense continue until we get into a major conflict and lose substantial assets and lives. There were opportunities for all to succeed and achieve higher ranks, regardless of where you came from or what you looked like - and all people were able to succeed. The mission came first. I immensely enjoyed my time in the Air Force and it was instrumental to my future success in life. I still believe that the military is an excellent path for young people to commit to their country, learn a ton and serve a great cause. However, it should not be tainted by shallow DEI initiatives that cause more harm than good. We need to get the recruitment up and should focus on the greatness of our country as the core of the recruiting pitch. It is a noble cause."

"As Sun Tzu wrote so many centuries ago- "The opportunity to defeat the enemy is provided by the enemy himself." This preoccupation with DEI is providing that opportunity."

"So . . . if you wanted to take down the United States . . . you'd *kinda sorta* want them to have a weak military . . . right? Makes you wonder

whether China is helping fund organizations behind the DEI push."

That means a newly minted Private or Lieutenant will have to navigate waters unfamiliar to previous generations of troops. Apparently, vast swaths of the enlisted ranks qualify for low income food assistance."

"I am a retired veteran of 26 years who recently recommended to a nephew that he not join. It all comes down to trust in the citizens of the country and the people they elect, but specifically: below average national leadership (I served in Afghanistan multiple times and the way we left was a preventable stain on the entire nation - all for a 11 September 2021 photo op); former-general offices and senior cabinet members who now believe it is their duty to weigh-in on national political elections - Kelly is just the latest (this increases the likelihood that future GOs will be excluded from key decisions that future presidents make, increasing the chance that a bad decision will be made); and DEI - how can I tell my white nephew that he will have a successful career based on his hard work and dedication to the institution ("we all bleed red" isn't applicable anymore). "I work on an Air Force base every day, retired USAF in 2009. What I see daily is so discouraging. The Air Force is a shell of what it used to be...quality, character, appearance, everything. Shameful."

"The US Army attempt to implement the Congressionally-mandated gender-neutral physical fitness standards by military occupational specialty

failed because so few women could meet the "neutral" standards. The Army returned to gender-based standards awaiting clarity from Congress. The experiment with women in combat arms and its impact on recruiting and combat standards must be evaluated and is the most salient DEI issue."

"First all, it is a good article and I agree with the author's point. As a USNA grad with a B/W mixed son who is also a USNA grad, I think I have a bit of an insight into this. They absolutely should get rid of any racial impact on the admissions, it doesn't do anything positive for anyone or specifically for the military. ## MILITARY COVID VAX **MANDATE**

"My son was in the ROTC program at his college and was on track for a contract with the Air Force to serve when the US govt mandated the vax. He is studying to be a constitutional lawyer and left the ROTC program because if he didn't stand up for himself how can he stand for others."

"Work/Fought 19 years 11 months 3 weeks 6 days with 1 day retirement pension ahead but kicked out by not taking an experimental shot, changed a few minds to join. That and woke attitudes!"

"My sister in law was a marine corps officer until a couple of months ago. Refused the shot but was so completely disgusted by the pathetic leadership that she was happy for the opportunity to get out."

"The Jab is what kept most of the young men that I know who were considering serving from going in ... that and that it's turned into a pervertfest. There's no way I could recommend them going into the service and potential combat next to some defective who doesn't know what it is. On top of that, why would you encourage a white kid to join a service that hates him?"

"My daughter is in the army, she fought against taking the jab all the way up until they were going to start giving dishonorable discharges to anyone that resisted. Luckily bc she did give some push back, she's only had one jab, THANK GOD! We have been blessed with her having good health, and she hasn't faced any complications so far. I am still praying for God to continue to protect her. She tried to get a religious exemption, but they denied everyone that was applying for the religious exemption too. She was in a group of soldiers from every ranking you can think of getting bullied and threatened their careers and they were all yelled at and forced to take the jab. She'll be gone for deployment next year, and I would not be surprised that they'll make her get a booster when she gets her international vaccines for travel."

"My family member was discharged from the Navy because he refused. He still hasn't heard if he can get any benefits at all after nearly 11 years of exemplary service."

"I'm military and was forced to get J&J and I've had weird issues ever since. All are mild thankfully. The worst part was watching everyone attack the ones strong enough to stand up to this. I always defended them."

"The forced Covid shots didn't help. My son stuck it out and somehow managed to stay in the guard, but he's lost respect for the man in the office. If they had contested him another time he was about to give up, not the honor he was seeking by joining in the first place."

"I got my injection while serving in the navy March 8 and for two years I experienced severe nerve pain in my whole upper left side. It was so debilitating, and I still deal with sporadic aches. It started right after getting the shot but the cause was completely disregarded. After rounds of tests and no anatomical physical evidence of what could be the

cause they just threw different medications at me. The reality is more testing should have been done before making anything mandatory, and service members should not be treated like Guinea pigs. What also sucked was still having swollen lymph nodes from the shot too that are calcified, I remember my doctor just saying "come back in 6 months if you still have these, I've been noticing them a lot with people who have been vaccinated" I was 22 year old young healthy woman none of what I have gone through makes sense. It was the first available round of the Pfizer shot. Anyways I used to think people were being dramatic but the proof is in the pudding."

"I refused to take the vaccine while I was still in despite all the threats of dishonorable discharge and disciplinary action, but I stood my ground, and I was able to finish my contract just fine with honorable status."

"I was a hair's breadth away from joining the Navy in 2020 at the ripe age of 24. I would've shipped that June. Papers were signed, and I was in DEP. Then COVID came around, and I backed out, trusting my gut instinct about what was on the horizon. I later relented around December of 2020 because, well, I'm broke with a degree, and I wanted \*some\* kind of job security in this failing economy... so I hit up the Air Force. I asked the Air Force recruiter about whether or not forced vaccinations would likely be a thing. He told me, "Never. Not a chance." I knew right then and there my former instincts were correct, and I never entered into a recruiting office again. The government doesn't care about you, whether you're a citizen or a serviceman. "I was an assistant first sergeant during the mando shot time. Big Air Force came down and basically said the ppl who refused the shot were gonna get admin actions and booted. Why? Because they would become non-deployable/lack readiness. Our squadron had 8 ppl on the chopping block and kicked one out just before the Ohio lawsuit.
