

INCLUSION FOR 2026 NDAA TO PROVIDE DATA TRANSPARENCY OF
CADETS/MIDSHIPMEN AT THE SERVICE ACADEMIES, SERVICE ACADEMY
PREPARATORY SCHOOLS, AND UNIFORMED SERVICES UNIVERSITY OF THE
HEALTH SCIENCES (USUHS)

WHEREAS, the United States Military Academy, the United States Naval Academy, the United States Air Force Academy, the United States Coast Guard Academy and the United States Merchant Marine Academy (collectively “Service Academies”), the Service Academy Preparatory Schools, and USUHS have lacked transparency in the selection processes for cadets/midshipmen and military medical students.

THEREFORE, the Service Academies shall compile and post databases readily accessible to the public online with the following de-identified data for all candidates that apply to the Service Academies from 1947 to the present. Databases will be updated annually for candidates with data for the cadets/midshipmen as they attend the Service Academies and graduate/separate. Databases shall be posted and available to the public within 180 days of the passage of the 2026 NDAA. Thereafter, the Service Academies shall update the databases no later than 1 December of each year. The Service Academies’ databases will contain at a minimum the following data: 1) candidates identified by number, 2) class year at matriculation, 3) gender, 4) race, 5) age at application, 6) age at matriculation, 7) SAT Score – math, 8) SAT Score – verbal/written, 9) ACT Score – English, 10) ACT Score – math, 11) ACT Score – reading, 12) ACT Score – science, 13) candidate cumulative GPA high school, 14) cumulative GPA high school grade scale, 15) high school class rank, 16) high school class size, 17) high school sport 1, 18) high school sport 2, 19) high school sport 3, 20) prior service Yes/No, 21) Service Academy Prep School attendance Yes/No, 22) athlete (priority recruit) Yes/No, 23) applicant qualified Yes/No, 24) applicant admitted Yes/No, 25) National Merit Scholar Yes/No, 26) Parent Academy Grad Yes/No, 27) Service Academy proprietary whole person score or equivalent, 28) attended remedial education (i.e., STAP) Yes/No while at Service Academy, 29) major at Service Academy, 30) minor at Service Academy, 31) service academy sport 1, 32) service academy sport 2, 33) honor investigation while at Service Academy (Yes/No), 34) honor conviction while at Service Academy (Yes/No), 35) disciplinary board while at Service Academy (Yes/No), 36) graduated (Yes/No), 37) graduated on time (Yes/No), 38) separated (reason – academics, honor, performance, discipline, choice), 39) branch/military specialty assigned at graduation, 40) branch/military specialty choice #1 (wish list), 41) branch/military specialty choice #2 (wish list), and 42) branch/military specialty choice #3 (wish list).

THEREFORE, Service Academies Preparatory Schools shall compile and post databases readily accessible to the public online with the following de-identified data for all candidates that apply at the Service Academy Preparatory Schools from 1947 to the present. Databases will be updated annually for candidates with data for the students as they attend the Service Academy Preparatory Schools and graduate/separate. Complete databases shall be posted online and available to the public within 180 days of the passage of the 2026 NDAA. Thereafter, Service Academy Preparatory Schools shall update the databases no later than 1 December of each year.

The Service Academy Preparatory School databases will contain at a minimum the following data: 1) candidate identified by number, 2) class Year at matriculation, 3) gender, 4) race, 5) age at application, 6) age at matriculation, 7) SAT Score – math, 8) SAT Score – verbal/written, 9) ACT Score – English, 10) ACT Score – math, 11) ACT Score – reading, 12) ACT Score – science, 13) candidate cumulative GPA high school, 14) cumulative GPA high school grade scale, 15) high school class rank, 16) high school class size, 17) high school sport 1, 18) high school sport 2, 19) high school sport 3, 20) prior service Yes/No, 21) athlete (priority recruit) Yes/No, 22) applicant Qualified Yes/No, 23) Applicant Admitted Yes/No, 24) national Merit Scholar Yes/No, 25) parent Service Academy grad Yes/No, 26) Service Academy Preparatory School proprietary whole person score, 27) attended remedial education (i.e., STAP) while at Service Academy Preparatory School Yes/No, 28) honor investigation while at Service Academy Preparatory School Yes/No, 29) honor conviction while at Service Academy Preparatory School Yes/No, (30) disciplinary board while at Service Academy Preparatory School Yes/No, 31) graduated Yes/No, 32) graduated on time Yes/No, and 33) separated (Reason – academics, honor, performance, discipline, choice).

THEREFORE, USUHS shall compile and post databases readily accessible to the public online with the following de-identified data for all candidates that apply to USUHS from 1976 to the present. Databases will be updated annually for candidates with data for the students as they matriculate at USUHS and graduate/separate. Complete databases shall be posted online and available to the public within 180 days of the passage of the 2026 NDAA. Thereafter, USUHS shall update the databases no later than 1 December of each year. The USUHS databases will contain at a minimum the following data: 1) candidate identified by number, 2) class year at matriculation, 3) gender, 4) race, 5) age at application, 6) age at matriculation, 7) prior service Yes/No, 8) Service Academy Graduate Yes/No, 9) ROTC Graduate Yes/No, 10) college cumulative GPA, 11) college cumulative GPA Scale, 12) MCAT Score, 13) applicant qualified Yes/No, 14) applicant accepted Yes/No, 15) graduated Yes/No, 16) graduated on time Yes/No, 17) separated (reason – academics, discipline, choice), and 18) medical specialty assigned at graduation.
